REPORT ON REFERENCES NOT DISPOSED OF AT THE END OF THE 44th PARLIAMENT

The Senate Community Affairs References Committee met on 1 September 2016 and resolved to recommend to the Senate:

That the following inquiries of the 44th Parliament be re-adopted:

- Inquiry into Indefinite detention of people with cognitive and psychiatric impairment in Australia, with a reporting date of Tuesday 29 November 2016;
- Inquiry into the Growing evidence of an emerging tick-borne disease that causes a Lyme like illness for many Australian patients, with a reporting date of Wednesday 30 November 2016;
- Inquiry into the Future of Australia's aged care sector workforce, with a reporting date of Friday 28 April 2017;

The committee also resolved to recommend to the Senate that the committee have the power to consider and use the records of the Senate Community Affairs References Committee appointed in the previous parliament.

The committee resolved to defer to a future private meeting consideration of whether to seek re-adoption of the inquiry into the medical complaints process in Australia.
