

Corrections on two entries in table provided on 8 December 2017 as part of a response to Question on Notice (SQ17-000657) asked at 23 October 2017-18 Supplementary Budget Estimates (at page 51 of Proof Hansard)

On page 73 of the table, the entry states:

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The Heritage Garden, Building, Ship Conservation – Melbourne Conservation and Management project was one of three projects under a successful Green Army proposal, which also included a habitat restoration and weed control project at bushland at Endeavour Fern Gully on the Mornington Peninsula. An administrative error occurred – the title and description of Protect 1 to this proposal was included in the table when Project 3 information should have been included.

The Department also reviewed the list of threatened species identified by the applicant. It is the Department’s view that the applicant erroneously included the incorrect species of bandicoot in the application (eastern-barred bandicoot instead of southern brown bandicoot (eastern)).

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On page 110, of the table, the entry states:

2	Stage two biodiversity and habitat improvements works / Braeside Park	VIC	World War II had a significant impact on the city of Townsville which became a major base for both Australian and American forces. A number of World War II sites remain intact today - many are recognized and protected through their inclusion in the Queensland Heritage Register. This project aims to deliver works necessary to conserve and maintain WWII military heritage remnants at Cape Pallarenda Conservation Park so that the original function of each installation is understood and site visits can be conducted easily and safely by community and tourists. The proposed on-ground works to be delivered include debris removal, conservation/maintenance of stonewalls and drains, upgrades to pathways, removal of graffiti and weed treatment. 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The project title is correct, however the description used for this project is incorrect. It erroneously refers to an unrelated project that has not been included in the list of projects supporting threatened species outcomes.

This table entry with the correct project description should state (changes highlighted):

Braeside Park is a diverse ecosystem of Red Gum Grassy Woodlands, heathland and wetlands and provides shelter for the Purple Diuris Orchid (<i>Diuris punctata</i>) and nationally significant migratory birds including the Latham's Snipe.
