The House of Representatives Standing Committee on Economics will scrutinise the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC) as part of its review of the performance and strengths of Australia's competition regulator.

The Chair of the committee, Mr David Coleman, MP, said 'the hearing will provide the committee with the opportunity to scrutinise the ACCC on its performance and operation.'

Mr Coleman commented 'the Government responded in May to a number of the Committee's recommendations to improve competition in the banking sector. This includes the announcement of \$13.2 million over four years to establish a dedicated banking competition unit at the ACCC. The Committee will question the ACCC on the unit's role in undertaking regular in-depth inquiries into specific financial system competition issues.'
