




The chart below shows the breakdown of advanced skills completed or currently being undertaken by Rural Generalist Trainees.




Rural Vocational Placement

Vocational applicants placed vs rural vacancies




Trainees / Fellows working rurally




Rural Generalist training position locations




Trainees / Fellows working in rural public vs private practice




Queensland Rural Generalist Trainee demographics
