3 PRIVILEGE—STATEMENT BY SPEAKER

The Speaker referred to the matter raised by Mr Martin yesterday concerning the premature publication on the *AM* radio program and other media of the contents of the report of the Standing Committee on Economics, Finance and Public Administration on regional banking services.

The Speaker stated that, in accordance with the procedures applicable in such matters, the issues must be considered in the first instance by the committee itself. The committee should consider first whether, in its opinion, the matter has caused or is likely to cause substantial interference with its work, with the committee system or with the functioning of the House. The Speaker stated that the committee must also take whatever steps it can to ascertain the source or sources of any disclosure.

The Speaker concluded by stating that the committee should inform the House of the results of its consideration of the matter and that if it concludes that substantial interference has occurred, it must explain why it reached this conclusion.

13 TEXTILE, CLOTHING AND FOOTWEAR STRATEGIC INVESTMENT PROGRAM BILL 1999

The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the Bill be now read a second time—*And on the amendment moved thereto by Mr McMullan, viz.*—That all words after "That" be omitted with a view to substituting the following words: "while not declining to give the bill a second reading, the House expresses its concern about the nature of the bill, in particular:

- (1) the lack of legislated detail about the TCF (Strategic Investment Program) Scheme;
- (2) the wide discretion given to the Minister to determine details of the Scheme;
- (3) the failure to require the Minister to formulate the Scheme by a specified date;
- (4) the failure to specify the size of the funding envelope for each of the grants contemplated under the Scheme;
- (5) the failure to specify the range of amounts available for individual grants under the Scheme; and
- (6) the failure to legislate the criteria for receiving grants under the Scheme"—

Debate resumed.

Amendment negatived.
