1 The House met, at 12.30 p.m., pursuant to adjournment. The Speaker (the Honourable David Hawker) took the Chair, and read Prayers.

#### 2 ROYAL COMMISSIONS AMENDMENT (RECORDS) BILL 2006

The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the bill be now read a second time—

Debate resumed by Ms Roxon who moved, as an amendment—That all words after "That" be omitted with a view to substituting the following words: "whilst not declining to give the bill a second reading, the House condemns the Government for seeking to avoid responsibility for the AWB scandal".

Debate continued.

Amendment negatived.

Question—That the bill be now read a second time—put and passed—bill read a second time.

Bill, by leave, taken as a whole.

On the motion of Mr Turnbull, by leave, Government amendments (1) to (6) were made together, after debate.

Bill, as amended, agreed to.

Leave granted for third reading to be moved immediately.

On the motion of Mr Turnbull, the bill was read a third time.
