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The Committee

The Standing Committee on Appropriations, Staffing and Security, appointed under standing order 19, determines the amounts for inclusion in the parliamentary appropriation bills and reports to the Senate on its determinations prior to the Senate's consideration of those bills.

The Committee examines matters affecting the staffing and administration of the Department of the Senate, including proposals to vary the staffing structure, and other matters referred to it by the Senate. The Committee makes an annual report to the Senate on the operations of the Senate's appropriations and staffing and related matters (standing order 19(3)).

Under a resolution of the Senate agreed to in 1987 the Committee also examines proposed changes in the structure and responsibilities of the parliamentary departments and, following the adoption by the Senate on 27 November 2012 of the recommendation in the Committee's 54th Report, the Committee may advise the President and the Senate on the administration and funding of information and communications technology services for the Parliament.

Following the adoption by the Senate on 25 March 2015 of a recommendation in the Procedure Committee's First Report of 2015, the Committee also considers the administration, operation and funding of security measures affecting the Senate, and advises the President and the Senate accordingly.

The Committee is chaired by the President and includes the Deputy President and the Senate Leaders of the Government and the Opposition as *ex officio* members.

57th Report

Introduction

Standing order 19 (2) and (3) requires that the Committee determine the amounts to be included in the parliamentary appropriation bills for the Department of the Senate.

Proposed Appropriations for 2015-16

The Committee notes that the Senate Department's 2015-16 appropriations have been calculated in accordance with current Commonwealth funding policy. Under this policy, the forward estimates reflect:

- a reduction in funding of \$0.64m due to the cessation of funding for the Parliamentary Joint Select Committee on the Constitutional Recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples;
- an increase in funding of \$0.2m, ongoing, to offset the department's increased fringe benefits tax liability arising from the introduction of paid parking in the parliamentary triangle; and
- a one-off funding measure for 2015-16 of \$1.5m to provide additional resources for each of the eight standing committee secretariats in response to ongoing elevated levels of committee activity.

The total appropriation to be approved by the Parliament in the appropriation bill for 2015-16 will be \$21.503m (compared to \$20.627m in 2014-15).

Special appropriations of \$23.907m will also be drawn down during the year (compared to an estimate of \$23.986m in 2014-15).

Conclusions

The Committee acknowledges the cessation of funding for the Parliamentary Joint Select Committee on the Constitutional Recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples, and the ongoing supplementation of funding for future FBT liabilities.

The Committee also welcomes the one-off funding measure of \$1.5m for additional committee resources, negotiated by the President with the Minister for Finance in lieu of the funding requests put forward by the Department with the endorsement of the (then) Appropriations and Staffing Committee. This measure – although less than the amount originally proposed by the Committee, and representing an allocation from the Contingency Reserve rather than shown as a budget measure included in the Budget Papers – should address the Department's immediate requirements. Elevated levels of committee activity,

should they continue, may necessitate the revisiting of the matter in the context of future Budgets.

Determination

The Committee determines that the total appropriation to be approved by the Parliament in the Appropriations (Parliamentary Departments) Bill (No 1) 2015-16 is \$21.503m and reports to the Senate accordingly.
