OPENING STATEMENT

- Thank you for the opportunity to appear before the Committee. Just over one year
 ago on 1 July 2016 the Australian Criminal Intelligence Commission (ACIC) was
 formed to strengthen Australia's ability to respond to crime affecting our nation. I will
 briefly outline the role and work of the ACIC for those Senators unfamiliar with the
 agency.
- The ACIC is Australia's national criminal intelligence agency, uniquely equipped with intelligence, investigative and information delivery functions.
- Our role includes reducing serious and organised crime threats of most harm to Australians and the national interest, and providing national policing information systems and services.
- The ACIC's current work priorities are designed to disrupt and deter criminal groups.
- The ACIC continues to deliver results benefiting the broader Australian community and assisting our national and international law enforcement partners. Whilst I cannot publicly discuss all of the work undertaken by ACIC due to ongoing law enforcement investigations, I would like to highlight the following activities:
- In the first 12 months the ACIC has:
 - o disseminated over 2,000 intelligence products
 - worked with our partners to seize nearly \$900million in drugs and over \$11 million in cash
 - o identified 118 new money laundering targets
 - o facilitated a record five million background checks
 - o assisted state, territory and commonwealth law enforcement partners to conduct more than 40 million National Police Reference System searches
 - o released, via the Australian Institute of Criminology, 31 research reports
 - o released the second National Wastewater Drug Monitoring Report, and
 - through joint operations with state, territory and federal partners, the ACIC contributed to:
 - limiting tax evasion
 - significant drugs, tobacco, firearms and cash seizures
 - advanced the understanding of licit and illicit drug usage in Australia, and
 - numerous OMGC members arrests.
