*Contingent on any message being received from the Senate transmitting any bill for concurrence:* Minister to move—That so much of the standing orders be suspended as would prevent the bill being passed through all its stages without delay.

- 1 **MS OWENS:** To move—That this House notes that:
  - (1) 26 October:
    - (a) was the celebration of Eid al-Adha, a special day in the calendar for Muslim Australians; and
    - (b) marked the beginning of Eid al-Adha, or the Festival of Sacrifice, commemorating Ibrahim's (Abraham's) willingness to sacrifice his son to God;
  - (2) for Muslims, Eid al-Adha is a time of peace, respect, sharing, caring and donating to those in need and is particularly special for Muslim children as it involves the exchanging of gifts and getting together with family; and
  - (3) this significant time coincides with the annual Hajj pilgrimage to Mecca in Saudi Arabia, and for all of our Australian Muslim friends who are travelling to Mecca, we wish you a safe trip on your way to, and home from, your spiritual journey. (*Notice given 30 October 2012.*)
- 2 **MR DANBY:** To move—That this House:
  - (1) urges the Australian people to remember those who perished and suffered as a result of the Ukrainian Famine 1932-33 (Holodomor), as a reminder that we should always respect the freedoms bestowed upon us; and
  - (2) joins the Ukrainian World Congress of Ukrainians and the Australian Federation of Ukrainian Organisations in calling on Australians to acknowledge the International Day of Remembrance on the last Saturday of November and gazetted by the Ukrainian Government, in respect of those who suffered and perished in the great famine of 1932-33. (*Notice given 26 November 2012.*)
- 3 **MS OWENS:** To move—That this House:
  - (1) notes that:
    - (a) there is community generated action to save key historical women's sites in Parramatta;
    - (b) the Parramatta Female Factory Friends/Action Group is campaigning to include Australia's earliest existing convict women's site, Parramatta Female Factory, on the National Heritage List;
    - (c) the Parramatta Female Factory Precinct Association is campaigning for both the Girls Industrial School/Catholic Orphanage and the Parramatta Female Factory to be placed on the National Heritage List;
    - (d) both groups:
      - (i) have petitions supporting preservation of the Female Factory site, with the Parramatta Female Factory Friends/Action Group having over 3,000 signatures and a further 2,000 web petitions, and the Parramatta Female Factory Precinct Association having over 5,000 signatures; and
      - (ii) are campaigning with a common goal to place Australia's earliest existing convict women's site on the National Heritage List;
    - (e) there is strong community support to have the sites nominated for world heritage listing;
    - (f) the work of these two groups and support from a broad cross-section of the Australian community indicates there is strong support for national heritage listing;
    - (g) the Parramatta Female Factory is a site where the Australian identity was forged and is therefore a site for all Australians, and the Girls Industrial School is a site that holds the stories of many forgotten Australian girls and women—both being of high heritage significance to Australian history;
    - (h) the Senate Community Affairs References Committee report *Forgotten Australians: A report on Australians who experienced institutional or out-of-home care as children* (2004) calls for 'the Commonwealth and State Governments, in conjunction with the Churches and agencies, to provide funding for the erection of suitable memorials commemorating care leavers';

- (i) the House of Representatives Standing Committee on Legal and Constitutional Affairs report *Half Way to Equal: the report of the inquiry into equal opportunity and equal status for women in Australia* (1992) recommends the establishment of a 'National Women's Place' recognising women's history and contribution; and
  - (j) in August 2012 the NSW Government announced the development of a master plan for the Parramatta Heritage Precinct and proposed a public/private enterprise to enable the 'adaptive reuse' of the heritage sites for commercial and residential purposes, posing a threat to its heritage values; and
- (2) calls on the Australian Government to:
- (a) seek the NSW Government's support to have the Parramatta Female Factory and the Girl's Industrial School placed on the 2013-14 Final Priority Assessment List for national heritage listing; and
  - (b) support the recommendations of the *Forgotten Australians* report, including to create a memorial garden, plaque and a heritage centre at the precinct using the buildings and grounds of the former Parramatta Girls Home as one of the projects to be priorities after a future successful national heritage listing. (*Notice given 28 November 2012.*)
- 4 MS OWENS:** To move—That this House:
- (1) notes that 21 February is International Mother Language Day, which has been celebrated every year since February 2000 when it was designated by UNESCO;
  - (2) acknowledges the:
    - (a) many different linguistic communities present in Australia and the significant contribution each of them makes to the cultural and linguistic diversity of our nation; and
    - (b) important role that preserving one's mother language plays in maintaining expressive, communicative and cultural traditions in our culturally diverse nation;
  - (3) recognises that linguistic diversity is a key element of cultural diversity and that recognition of this diversity is a step towards greater intercultural understanding and harmony;
  - (4) acknowledges the special significance International Mother Language Day has for the Bengali community in Australia, commemorating the day in 1952 when Bengalis lost their lives while peacefully protesting the right to speak their mother language; and
  - (5) congratulates all community based organisations for promoting linguistic and cultural diversity in Australia and internationally. (*Notice given 11 February 2013.*)
- 5 MR GEORGANAS:** To move—That this House:
- (1) condemns in the strongest possible terms, the continuing cruel slaughter of Australian sheep at the Al Rai meat market in Kuwait City;
  - (2) supports the urgent finalisation of all investigations into live exports currently being conducted by the Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry including those relating to possible breaches in Kuwait, Pakistan, Israel and Mauritius;
  - (3) demands the strongest possible penalties to be imposed immediately for any found contraventions;
  - (4) calls on the Minister for Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry to review the Exporter Supply Chain Assurance System to ensure its integrity, efficacy and adequacy;
  - (5) notes the sustained level of public concern in the community about live exports in general including the widely held desire for a total shut down of the industry; and
  - (6) recognises the economic and employment creation potential of expanded meat processing in Australia and encourages the Government to actively pursue development opportunities with industry. (*Notice given 12 February 2013.*)

  - (b) with funding support from the Government, the 37 metropolitan-wide community radio stations in Melbourne, Brisbane, Sydney, Adelaide and Perth launched digital radio services in May 2011; and
  - (c) in the 2012 budget, the Government allocated \$2.2 million per annum for four years to support community digital radio services but this is a shortfall of \$ 1.4 million per year for the minimum level of funding required to maintain transmission of all current services; and
- (2) calls on the Government to commit the necessary funding for community broadcasters' digital radio services in the 2013-14 Budget. (*Notice given 12 March 2013.*)

9 **MS HALL:** To move—That this House:

- (1) recognises 50 years of service by Lifeline in our community, in particular in the area of suicide prevention; and
- (2) acknowledges:
  - (a) all the good work done by Lifeline; and
  - (b) that Lifeline is a national institution in Australia. (*Notice given 12 March 2013.*)

10 **MR CHRISTENSEN:** To move—That this House:

- (1) notes:
  - (a) that the television series Doctor Who will celebrate its fiftieth anniversary on the 23 November 2013;
  - (b) that the fiftieth anniversary of the first screening of Doctor Who in Australia will take place on the 12 January 2015;
  - (c) the many connections between Doctor Who and Australia including (but not limited to):
    - (i) the very first Doctor Who story, 'An Unearthly Child', written by Australian scriptwriter Anthony Coburn;
    - (ii) the score for the signature Doctor Who theme tune, written by Australian composer Ron Grainer;
    - (iii) the incidental music in the series throughout most of the 1960s and 1970s, written by Australian composer Dudley Simpson;
    - (iv) Australian actress Janet Fielding, playing an Australian character Tegan Jovanka in the series (alongside the Doctor as portrayed by Peter Davison);
    - (v) actress Katy Manning, playing the character Jo Grant in the series (alongside the Doctor as portrayed by Jon Pertwee), and becoming an Australian citizen in 2004; and
    - (iv) Australian pop star Kylie Minogue, playing the character Astrid (alongside the Doctor as portrayed by David Tennant) in the 2007 Christmas Special 'Voyage of the Damned'; and
  - (d) the fact that the Australian Broadcasting Corporation (ABC) has been the main broadcaster for Doctor Who in Australia; and
- (2) requests that:
  - (a) in celebration of the fiftieth anniversary of the first screening of Doctor Who in Australia, the British Broadcasting Corporation (BBC) consider filming the 2015 series of the television show in Australia; and
  - (b) the ABC, Screen Australia and the various State-based film funding bodies consider offering finance to entice the BBC to film the 2015 series of Doctor Who in Australia. (*Notice given 13 March 2013.*)

11 **DR LEIGH:** To move—That this House notes:

- (1) economists, businesses and industry support a price on carbon as the most efficient means of cutting pollution and tackling dangerous climate change;
- (2) the *Clean Energy Act 2011* establishes an emissions trading scheme with a three year fixed price period;
- (3) that in the first nine months of the carbon price, the predicted wrecking ball to the economy has resulted in:
  - (a) real GDP growing by 1.2 per cent;

- (b) employment rising by 53,400 people;
  - (c) the All Ordinaries index rising by 25 per cent, adding \$296 billion to the value of Australian shares;
  - (d) the Wage Price Index rising by 1.5 per cent and average weekly earnings rising by \$39.10 per week;
  - (e) interest rates falling to three per cent;
  - (f) Westpac consumer sentiment rising to 13.3 per cent, a 38 month high; and
  - (g) Australia retaining its AAA credit rating from the three major rating agencies; and
- (4) in addition to the above, emissions in the National Electricity Market were 8.6 per cent lower in the first six months of the carbon price than in the corresponding six months in 2011, and electricity production is cleaner, with emissions per megawatt hour falling by around 6 per cent. (*Notice given 13 March 2013.*)
- 12 **MR BANDT:** To move—That this House calls for all asylum seekers and refugees who are released into the community on a bridging visa to be granted the right to work and support themselves. (*Notice given 14 May 2013.*)
- 13 **MR ADAMS:** To move—That this House:
- (1) recognises that traditional industries across Australia are changing and the live animal export industry is too;
  - (2) notes that traditional live animal markets are shrinking, Indonesia is breeding its own animals and other countries are becoming more difficult to service;
  - (3) acknowledges that public reaction to animal welfare is becoming more pronounced, it is becoming less acceptable to transport animals over long distances, and the media is bringing bad practices into our living rooms more quickly, drawing attention to them and the widely held desire for a total shut down of the industry;
  - (4) recognises the economic and employment creation potential of expanded meat processing in Australia;
  - (5) calls for a review of the animal export industry in close consultation with those affected to see how the Government might help the phasing out of live animal export and finding alternative and new markets for slaughtered meat; and
  - (6) encourages the industry peak body to work with government agencies to assist and help fund the change of direction in the marketing of export meat rather than live animal. (*Notice given 27 May 2013; amended 27 May 2013.*)
- 14 **MR KATTER:** To move—That this House:
- (1) acknowledges that:
    - (a) a strong and sustainable manufacturing industry is integral to Australia's economic and technological advancement;
    - (b) Australia's motor vehicle industry workforce has shrunk by one-third in the past decade (from 78,700 in May 2003 to 50,100 by February 2013); and
    - (c) the share of Australian-made vehicle sales domestically has decreased from 73 per cent in 1987 (317,000 Australian units sold versus 435,000 imported units) to 12 per cent in 2012 (140,000 Australian units sold versus 972,000 imported units); and
  - (2) calls on the Australian Government to mandate that all motor vehicles purchased by Local, State and Territory and Commonwealth governments be Australian-made predominantly using Australian steel. (*Notice given 28 May 2013.*)
- 15 **MR L. D. T. FERGUSON:** To move—That this House notes that:
- (1) March 2013 marked the twenty-fifth anniversary of the genocidal chemical attack by the regime of Iraqi dictator Saddam Hussein on Halabja in the Kurdish region of Iraq that took at least 4,000 lives within a few minutes and displaced many thousands more, as part of his brutal Anfal Campaign of the 1980s targeting Kurdish and other minorities in Iraq;
  - (2) some 4,000 villages, 2,000 schools and 300 hospitals were destroyed, including through the use of chemical weapons across dozens of Kurdish villages;
  - (3) the regime was also responsible for the:
    - (a) deportation or forced relocation of tens of thousands of Faili Kurds on the basis that they were not considered Iraqi;
    - (b) abduction and execution of an estimated 8,000 Barzani Kurds who were subsequently buried in mass graves in southern Iraq; and
    - (c) arrest, execution and subsequent burial of up to 100,000 Iraqi Kurds in 1988, including women and children; and

- (4) Saddam Hussein and Ali Hassan Majid, known as Chemical Ali, were subsequently prosecuted and convicted for these and other crimes. (*Notice given 3 June 2013.*)
- 16 **MR BANDT:** To move—That this House calls on the Government to ratify the International Convention on the Protection of the Rights of All Migrant Workers and Members of Their Families. (*Notice given 17 June 2013.*)
- 17 **MR KATTER:** To move—That this House:
- (1) acknowledges that:
    - (a) with the high Australian dollar, local food producers cannot compete with their foreign counterparts who can import at a cost of up to 60 per cent less, at the expense of Australian jobs and industry;
    - (b) SPC Ardmona:
      - (i) has lost a significant domestic market share of packaged fruit due to produce imported for the supermarket giants' 'inexpensive supermarket brand' private labels, which represents a 33 per cent decrease for local market share and a 58 per cent growth for imported supermarket brand market share, of packaged fruit;
      - (ii) is Goulburn Valley's biggest private employer and Australia's last fruit processor and if it collapses, more farmers will be forced to let fruit rot on the ground; and
      - (iii) has 870 full-time equivalent staff;
      - (iv) supports 2,700 jobs in the Goulburn Valley region, injects \$63 million into the local economy through salaries and wages and provides apprenticeships for young people in the region; and
      - (v) utilises products from more than 200 contract growers and has bought 150,000 tonnes of fruit and vegetables worth \$32 million from contract growers; and
    - (c) calls on the Government to endorse temporary emergency safeguards (permitted under World Trade Organization rules) to food producers, including SPC Ardmona. (*Notice given 18 June 2013.*)
- 18 **MR KATTER:** To move—That this House:
- (1) acknowledges that:
    - (a) in Europe it is mandatory to have 'black box' technology in all trucks;
    - (b) the 'black box' technology is removed from trucks made in Europe before they are shipped to Australia;
    - (c) in Europe 15 per cent of the trucks run off the road through driver fatigue, compared with 50 per cent in Australia under the 'old-fashioned logbook system';
    - (d) in Europe, 'black box' technology has reduced accidents by over 30 per cent; and
    - (e) 'black box' technology minimises human tragedy and business impacts of fatal road accidents; and
  - (2) calls on the Government to introduce legislation to ensure that 'black box' technology is fitted to all trucks in Australia, excluding livestock haulage. (*Notice given 18 June 2013.*)
- 19 **MS OWENS:** To move—That this House:
- (1) notes:
    - (a) that section 18C of the *Racial Discrimination Act 1975* makes it unlawful to publish material which offends or insults a person or group because 'of the race, colour or national or ethnic origin of the person, or of some or all of the people in the group';
    - (b) that freedom of religion runs deep in our culture and is featured in our Constitution and in international human rights jurisprudence, and that it includes the right to have or not have a religion, and to manifest religious belief individually or with others, in public or in private and to do so without fear of reprisal, abuse or discrimination; and
    - (c) reports from the Australian Islamic community of a rise in religious vilification and discrimination, particularly in respect of women and girls who wear religiously significant garments such as the hijab;
  - (2) acknowledges calls by the Australian Islamic community to strengthen human rights and anti-discrimination laws to include religious vilification and discrimination;
  - (3) notes that the Attorney-General, as part of the review of the exposure draft of the Human Rights and Anti-Discrimination Bill 2012, has asked his department to thoroughly assess submissions made to the Senate Standing Committee on Legal and Constitutional Affairs, including many which recommend that the Government takes a step forward in protecting the community from religious vilification and discrimination; and
  - (4) urges the Parliament to:



- (a) uphold protections against racial vilification that are already in place under section 18C of the *Racial Discrimination Act 1975*; and
  - (b) ensure that protections and safeguards are in place to protect religious freedom in Australia. (*Notice given 18 June 2013.*)
- 20 **MR PERRETT:** To move—That this House condemns the comments made by Senator Cory Bernardi regarding bestiality and the damaging effects that will flow on to the members of the gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender and intersex community because of his thoughtless, ill-considered and ill-informed understanding in this area. (*Notice given 18 June 2013.*)
- 21 **MR BANDT:** To present a Bill for an Act to amend the *Telecommunications Act 1997*, and for related purposes. (*Telecommunications Amendment (Protecting Local Workers) Bill 2013*) (*Notice given 24 June 2013.*)
- 22 **MR RUDDOCK:** To move—That this House:
- (1) notes that in East Timor between December 1941 and January 1943, 700 Australian troops engaged some 20,000 Japanese troops through guerrilla warfare, and:
    - (a) this severely hampered the Japanese war effort by preventing its troops from being deployed elsewhere; and;
    - (b) in this endeavour, Australian troops were assisted by the East Timorese people;
  - (2) recognises that while Australian troops were in East Timor between December 1941 and January 1943, and after they had left, some 40,000 East Timorese are estimated to have died as a result of protecting Australian soldiers; and
  - (3) commends and thanks the people of Timor-Leste for the sacrifices they made in supporting Australia during World War II. (*Notice given 26 June 2013.*)

  - (b) that Australia now has the fourth largest pool of retirement fund assets among OECD states;
  - (c) the key findings in the report prepared by the Allen Consulting Group for the Association of Superannuation Funds of Australia, *Enhancing Financial Stability and Economic Growth: The Contribution of Superannuation*, that the:
    - (i) superannuation sector assisted Australia in avoiding some of the worst consequences of the Global Financial Crisis;
    - (ii) increase in the Superannuation Guarantee from nine to twelve per cent will benefit 8.4 million Australians; and
    - (iii) superannuation sector plays an increasingly important role helping to fund Australia's investment needs;
  - (d) data from the Australian Bureau of Statistics that whilst the mean superannuation balance for women almost doubled in the period between 2000 and 2007, there remains considerable disparity in the mean superannuation balances in the accumulation phase for females compared to males;

      - (iii) presence at the 2011 census of 8,441 Peruvian born citizens in Australia and attraction of Peru to Australian visitors totalling 30,000 in 2011; and
      - (iv) longstanding Australian mining endeavours in Peru, the growth of Peruvian student numbers in Australia and 56 Australian companies having an office in Peru or investment in a Peruvian project.

- 1 **COMPETITION AND CONSUMER AMENDMENT (STRENGTHENING RULES ABOUT MISUSE OF MARKET POWER) BILL 2013** (*Mr Oakeshott*): Second reading—Resumption of debate (*from 24 June 2013—Mr Oakeshott, in continuation*).
- 2 **INTERNATIONAL CLEANERS DAY:** Resumption of debate (*from 24 June 2013*) on the motion of Mr Georganas—That this House:
- (1) acknowledges that 15 June is International Cleaners Day, recognising cleaners all over the world for their work and efforts;
  - (2) recognises the:
    - (a) importance and significance of the work of cleaners; and
    - (b) important contributions of cleaners across the Australian community;
  - (3) supports the call for a fair go for cleaners and recognises that cleaners are some of the lowest paid workers in Australia; and
  - (4) congratulates all cleaners for their achievements and the work that they have done in advocating for the rights of fellow cleaners through the Clean Start campaign.
- 3 **RARE DISEASES:** Resumption of debate (*from 24 June 2013*) on the motion of Ms Hall—That this House:
- (1) notes that:
    - (a) rare diseases are complex, often with inadequate or no treatment;
    - (b) approximately 10 per cent of the Australian population is directly affected by one or more of the 8000 rare diseases and 400,000 of these people are children; and
    - (c) collectively there are around 1.2 million Australians with a rare disease, the same number as Australians affected by diabetes;
  - (2) recognises that:
    - (a) Australians living with rare diseases need the opportunity to be involved in national and international clinical trials; and
    - (b) in order to progress medical research in the field of rare diseases, the benefits of a national rare disease registry should be investigated;
  - (3) acknowledges:

- (a) Rare Voices Australia, the first national organisation devoted to rare diseases in Australia that focuses on improving quality of life for all families, friends and carers that are impacted by a rare disease in their everyday lives; and
  - (b) the participation of advocates from Rare Voices Australia in a world first International Rare Diseases Research Consortium this year; and
  - (4) investigates establishing a national patient registry for research purposes for people living with a rare disease, which is free of commercial interests.
- 4 **CYBER-SAFETY:** Resumption of debate (*from 24 June 2013*) on the motion of Ms Marino—That this House:
- (1) acknowledges that:
    - (a) cyber-bullying and inadequate cyber-safety poses a significant threat to the welfare and security of all Australians, especially young people; and
    - (b) this threat will increase with new technology and greater connectivity; and
  - (2) calls on the Government to enhance cyber-safety education in all Australian schools. (*On 5 June 2013, the Selection Committee recommended that this order of the day be voted on.*)
- 5 **MARRIAGE EQUALITY AMENDMENT BILL 2012** (*Mr Bandt*): Second reading—Resumption of debate (*from 24 June 2013*). (*On 16 February 2012, the Selection Committee made a determination that this Bill be referred to the Standing Committee on Social Policy and Legal Affairs, and the Committee reported on 18 June 2012.*)
- 6 **AUSTRALIAN EMBASSY IN HUNGARY:** Resumption of debate (*from 24 June 2013*) on the motion of Mr Slipper—That this House:
- (1) calls on the Government to reverse its disappointing and retrograde decision announced in the Budget to close the Australian Embassy in Hungary, based in Budapest; and
  - (2) acknowledges the:
    - (a) close relationship that exists between our two countries, including our shared democratic values which see us cooperate in numerous international fora as demonstrated by our mutual support for each other's candidature for non-permanent seats on the United Nations Security Council, our joint support for peace building efforts of the international community, particularly in Afghanistan, and our mutual cooperation in difficult times, for example, Hungary's consular assistance for Australian citizens in Syria;
    - (b) important interdependence of Hungary and Australia in providing a bridge for Australia into central Europe and Australia's reciprocal role in providing access for Hungary in the Asia Pacific region, and that this growing bilateral relationship will further boost economic ties and trade particularly Australian investments in the Hungarian energy sector;
    - (c) close people-to-people links which see up to 250,000 Australians of Hungarian origin making an important contribution both economically and culturally to the relationship between the two countries and assisting to promote the close friendship among Australia, Hungary and other countries of central Europe; and
    - (d) fact that in addition to the Hungarian Embassy in Canberra, Hungary has recently opened a consulate in Melbourne to contribute further to the growing strength of the bilateral relationship.
- 7 **NATURAL GAS:** Resumption of debate (*from 24 June 2013*) on the motion of Mr S. P. Jones—That this House notes that:
- (1) Australia has an abundance of natural gas reserves, with gas production projected to quadruple from 2095 petajoules in 2010 to over 8,000 petajoules in 2034-35;
  - (2) the export of natural gas is booming, projected to triple from 20 million tonnes in 2010-11 to over 63 million tonnes by 2017;
  - (3) at the same time Australia's primary energy consumption of gas is expected to increase from 22 per cent in 2008-09 to 35 per cent in 2034-35, which is consistent with Government policy to shift households and businesses to more efficient and less carbon intensive energy sources;
  - (4) in Australia, manufacturing, mining and electricity generation are the largest consumers of gas, consuming 84 per cent;
  - (5) driven by near-term infrastructure and supply constraints, Australia is facing a price squeeze on gas at the same time as many large contracts for gas supply expire from 2014;
  - (6) Australian manufacturing and domestic suppliers are therefore heavily exposed to rising prices and access to contracts for supply of gas at competitive pricing;
  - (7) in North America, governments have adopted the strategy of giving priority to domestic supply at affordable prices over other uses as a means of reinvigorating their manufacturing sector, which has led to the establishment of new businesses in the United States and the creation of over 500,000 new manufacturing jobs; and

- (8) steps must be taken to ensure that affordable and reliable gas is available for manufacturing and households and that the Government must bring forward policy to achieve this.

8 **SHARPS INJURIES:** Resumption of debate (*from 24 June 2013*) on the motion of Dr Washer—That this House:

- (1) recognises the significant hazard to healthcare workers through needlestick, scalpel and other sharps injuries, with estimates of up to 18,000 healthcare employees suffering injuries each year;
- (2) notes that these injuries present a serious health and safety risk, exposing healthcare workers to dangerous blood-borne pathogens including the Hepatitis B Virus, Hepatitis C Virus and Human Immunodeficiency Virus;
- (3) is:
  - (a) concerned that approximately 50 per cent of needlestick, scalpel and other sharps injuries are not reported, with rates of under-reporting ranging from 40 per cent to 80 per cent; and
  - (b) aware that 1 in 9 nurses suffered at least one needlestick, scalpel or other sharps injury in the past 12 months;
- (4) acknowledges that preventative measures can be taken to reduce injury, including the use of safety engineered medical devices which, when combined with relevant education and training, reduces the incidence of sharps injuries;
- (5) notes that Australia lags behind other western countries that have mandated measures to reduce sharps injuries, such as:
  - (a) the United States, that signed into law more than a decade ago the *Needlestick Safety and Prevention Act of 2000*, 106 USC 430 (2000);
  - (b) Canada, where 6 out of 10 provinces have Occupational Health and Safety Regulations mandating the use of safety engineered medical devices;
  - (c) the United Kingdom, where the Health and Safety Executive has introduced the Health and Safety (Sharp Instruments) Regulations 2013; and
  - (d) the European Union, that introduced Council Directive 2010/32/EU three years ago to ‘prevent blood borne infections to hospital and healthcare workers from sharp instruments’; and
- (6) calls on the Government to immediately improve healthcare worker safety by bringing Australia into line with the abovementioned countries.

—*And on the amendment moved thereto by Mr Zappia, viz.*—That paragraph (6) be amended to read:

- (6) calls on the Government to request SafeWork Australia members, including State and Territory representatives, to consider a review of existing work, health and safety guidance material on preventing sharps injuries. The review should consider mandatory measures in place in the abovementioned countries. (*On 26 June 2013, the Selection Committee recommended that this order of the day be voted on.*)

9 **BOWEL CANCER:** Resumption of debate (*from 17 June 2013*) on the motion of Ms Hall—That this House:

- (1) notes that:
  - (a) Wednesday 19 June 2013 is Red Aussie Apple Day, part of the month-long national campaign throughout June to raise awareness of bowel cancer;
  - (b) more than 14,000 Australians will be diagnosed with bowel cancer this year;
  - (c) bowel cancer is Australia’s second biggest killer after lung cancer, claiming the lives of 77 Australians every week; and
  - (d) bowel cancer is one of the most curable forms of cancer when detected early;
- (2) recognises:
  - (a) bowel cancer can develop without any early warning signs;
  - (b) if bowel cancer is detected before it has spread beyond the bowel, there is a 90 per cent chance of surviving more than five years;
  - (c) that regular screening every two years for people aged 50 and over can reduce the risk of dying from bowel cancer by up to 33 per cent; and
  - (d) more than 12,000 suspected or confirmed cancers will be detected through free screening, saving between 300 and 500 lives each year;
- (3) commends the Government for its four year commitment to provide an extra \$49.7 million boost to the National Bowel Cancer Screening Program; and
- (4) encourages Members to continue support efforts to raise awareness of the importance of early detection as well as the signs and symptoms of bowel cancer.

- 10 **NATIONAL BUSINESS NAMES REGISTER:** Resumption of debate (*from 17 June 2013*) on the motion of Mr Billson—That this House:
- (1) the national business names register has been in operation since 28 May 2012;
  - (2) the Government has failed to act to fix implementation problems with the national business names register, which has left the privacy of home based businesses exposed;
  - (3) businesses have been waiting on hold for up to 45 minutes to progress to an operator when contacting the Australian Securities and Investment Commission’s hotline; and
  - (4) a large number of people have had problems registering, renewing, paying and transferring business names since the national business names register started operating. (*On 19 June 2013, the Selection Committee recommended that this order of the day be voted on.*)
- 11 **CANNED FOOD INDUSTRY:** Resumption of debate (*from 17 June 2013*) on the motion of Dr Stone—That this House:
- (1) acknowledges the economic contribution of fruit growers and workers in the local food processing industry;
  - (2) recognises the impact and toll that the increased cost of doing business has on local food processors;
  - (3) acknowledges the significance of iconic local food processors as key employers and contributors to regional communities;
  - (4) supports the ‘Toss a tin in your trolley’ campaign to encourage Australians to throw a tin of local canned produce into their shopping trolley, and urges supermarkets to promote this initiative; and
  - (5) calls on the:
    - (a) Treasurer to investigate an emergency World Trade Organisation safeguard action in respect of imported canned fruit and tomato produce; and
    - (b) Government to undertake an immediate and comprehensive anti-dumping investigation in respect of the request from SPC Ardmona and the canned food industry. (*On 19 June 2013, the Selection Committee recommended that this order of the day be voted on.*)
- 12 **MARINE ENGINEERS QUALIFICATIONS BILL 2013** (*Mr Wilkie*): Second reading—Resumption of debate (*from 3 June 2013*). (*On 5 June 2013, the Selection Committee recommended that this order of the day be voted on.*)
- 13 **REFORM AGENDA FOR OLDER AUSTRALIANS:** Resumption of debate (*from 3 June 2013*) on the motion of Ms Hall—That this House:
- (1) acknowledges that the Government has a positive reform agenda for older Australians and is delivering enormous commitment and investment in aged care and promoting positive aged care issues by:
    - (a) increasing the aged pension;
    - (b) reforming the aged care system; and
    - (c) helping older Australians stay at work longer; and
  - (2) calls on all Members to support the reforms and guarantee support for older Australians.
- 14 **HUMAN RIGHTS IN BAHRAIN:** Resumption of debate (*from 3 June 2013*) on the motion of Mr L. D. T. Ferguson—That this House:
- (1) notes that:
    - (a) 14 February marked two years since the outbreak of the 2011 period of major unrest in the Kingdom of Bahrain;
    - (b) the 2011 unrest in Bahrain has been characterised by a mass protest movement calling for constitutional, political and election reform;
    - (c) since the beginning of the protest movement in Bahrain, there have been reports of ongoing human rights violations against opposition figures, demonstrators and medical practitioners at the hands of the authorities, including fatalities and arbitrary political arrests; and
    - (d) there have been reports of acts of violence against the State, resulting in injury and, in some cases, fatalities;
  - (2) welcomes the resumption of Bahrain’s National Dialogue on 10 February 2013 as a positive step towards political and related reform and reconciliation, and urges all parties to commit fully to the process and to reject violence; and
  - (3) calls on the Government of the Kingdom of Bahrain to:
    - (a) follow through on its commitment to full implementation of the recommendations of the November 2011 report of the Bahrain Independent Commission of Inquiry on human rights violations during the 2011 unrest;

- (b) release political prisoners who were arrested arbitrarily, investigate new reports of human rights abuses and bring the perpetrators to justice;
- (c) respect the human rights of its people including the right to freely protest and the right of medical staff to give unhindered treatment to those injured while protesting; and
- (d) commit to genuine reform that addresses the legitimate concerns and aspirations of the people of Bahrain.

**15 ERADICATION OF POLIO:** Resumption of debate (*from 3 June 2013*) on the motion of Ms Parke—That this House:

- (1) commends the Government for its four year commitment to provide \$50 million to support the global eradication of polio;
- (2) notes:
  - (a) that in February 2012, India was removed from the list of countries where polio remains endemic, proving that eradication strategies are effective when they are fully implemented and that polio can be eradicated even in the toughest circumstances, and there has not been a single reported case of polio in India since January 2011;
  - (b) that polio eradication should, wherever possible, be part of routine immunisation efforts to improve population immunity for all priority, vaccine preventable childhood illnesses;
  - (c) that there are now only three countries in the world where polio has never been stopped, namely Afghanistan, Pakistan and Nigeria, and unless the polio program is fully funded and emergency plans are implemented as planned, polio could make a comeback in countries that are currently polio-free;
  - (d) estimates show that global re-infection over time could result in as many as 200,000 children per year being paralysed;
  - (e) that the Global Polio Eradication Initiative currently faces a funding shortfall of US\$945 million for the full implementation of its 2012-13 Emergency Action Plan, and this has caused immunisation campaigns to be cancelled or scaled back in 33 countries in Africa and Asia, leaving more children vulnerable to the disease and increasing the risk of the international spread of polio; and
  - (f) the recent landmark resolution by the Sixty-fifth World Health Assembly declaring the completion of polio eradication, a programmatic emergency for global public health, with member states highlighting the feasibility of eradication in the near-term, while expressing concern at the ongoing funding gap threatening success; and
- (3) encourages the Government to continue to support efforts to deliver a polio-free world and to encourage other countries to do likewise.

**16 CHRISTIAN ASSYRIANS IN IRAQ:** Resumption of debate (*from 3 June 2013*) on the motion of Mr Ruddock—That this House:

- (1) recognises that:
  - (a) Christian Assyrians, a minority religious and racial group in Iraq, are subject to ongoing violence, intimidation, harassment and discrimination on religious and ethnic grounds;
  - (b) on 31 October 2010, 58 Christian Assyrians were killed in an attack on a church in Baghdad, in an act of violent extremism targeting this minority group;
  - (c) Christian Assyrians are actively discriminated against by having their land illegally occupied and transferred to squatters;
  - (d) 600,000 Christian Assyrians have now fled Iraq, including many thousands to Australia; and
  - (e) Assyrians remaining in Iraq are denied many basic human rights and subject to ongoing harassment, intimidation and discrimination;
- (2) condemns violence, intimidation, harassment and discrimination on religious and ethnic grounds wherever it may be found, including in Iraq; and
- (3) calls upon the Australian Government to raise the significant human rights concerns of Christian Assyrians with the Iraqi Government. (*On 5 June 2013, the Selection Committee recommended that this order of the day be voted on.*)

**17 VOICE FOR ANIMALS (INDEPENDENT OFFICE OF ANIMAL WELFARE) BILL 2013** (*Mr Bandt*): Second reading—Resumption of debate (*from 3 June 2013*).

**18 PHELAN MCDERMID SYNDROME:** Resumption of debate (*from 27 May 2013*) on the motion of Mr Hayes—That this House:

- (1) notes that:
  - (a) Phelan McDermid Syndrome is a rare and debilitating disease that affects about 30 people in Australia; and

- (b) the condition is most commonly caused by the novo chromosomal deletion which results in a syndrome that is autism related;
  - (2) recognises the important role the Phelan McDermid Syndrome Foundation has in providing support to families; and
  - (3) acknowledges the:
    - (a) physical, emotional and financial impact on families where a child is diagnosed with Phelan McDermid Syndrome; and
    - (b) efforts of Megan Toole in raising awareness of this rare disease and supporting the affected families.
- 19 **BELMONT AND TINGIRA HEIGHTS FIRE STATIONS:** Resumption of debate (*from 27 May 2013*) on the motion of Ms Hall—That this House:
- (1) acknowledges the outstanding contribution made by both full time, retained fire fighters and volunteer fire fighters within our community;
  - (2) notes with deep concern that:
    - (a) over the course of the past month, the Belmont and Tingira Heights fire stations have been closed or ‘taken off line’ for a combined total of over 70 hours as result of a cost cutting exercise by the NSW Government; and
    - (b) the practice of taking fire stations off line is wide spread throughout NSW as a result of cost cutting measures and staffing reallocations conducted by the NSW Government;
  - (3) condemns in the strongest possible terms the:
    - (a) ongoing closures of the Belmont and Tingira Heights fire stations;
    - (b) NSW Government’s apparent cavalier attitude towards the safety of the people within the NSW electoral division of Shortland; and
    - (c) NSW Government’s alleged attempts to threaten fire fighters who advertise the closure of the Belmont and Tingira Heights fire stations within the local community; and
  - (4) demands that adequate staff be allocated to Belmont and Tingira Heights fire stations to ensure adequate fire protection is provided to all residents in the NSW electoral division of Shortland.
- 20 **NATIONAL ELECTRICITY BILL 2012** (*Mr Oakeshott*): Second reading—Resumption of debate (*from 27 May 2013*). (*On 1 November 2012, the Selection Committee made a determination that this Bill be referred to the Standing Committee on Infrastructure and Communications, and the Committee reported on 11 February 2013.*)
- 21 **PUBLIC TRANSPORT IN SOUTH EAST QUEENSLAND:** Resumption of debate (*from 27 May 2013*) on the motion of Mr Perrett—That this House:
- (1) opposes the Queensland Government’s plans to cut local bus services in South East Queensland;
  - (2) notes that these cuts will:
    - (a) affect many vulnerable residents that can least afford it—seniors, pensioners, part-time working mums and dads and students; and
    - (b) have broader consequences, such as:
      - (i) negatively impacting on timetables for remaining services;
      - (ii) reducing access to Park’n’Rides and connecting train services; and
      - (iii) increasing the number of vehicles using on-street parking, clogging residential streets and putting more cars on local roads;
  - (3) strongly supports better public transport in Queensland;
  - (4) notes the:
    - (a) changes are geared towards cutting ‘community’ bus services and moving towards a more profitable commuter service;
    - (b) changes will create confusion and significantly increase travel time for commuters, and will be a backward step towards improving South East Queensland’s public transport network; and
    - (c) Queensland Government’s privatisation plans regarding other state-owned assets and government services, and condemns any move to sell-out Queensland’s public transport network;
  - (5) calls on the Queensland Government to rule out these cuts to South East Queensland’s public transport system; and
  - (6) notes:
    - (a) the Coalition’s failure to condemn these cuts despite the Federal Leader of the Opposition and Federal Shadow Treasurer recently making flying stops to Queensland;

- (b) that the Leader of the Opposition of the Brisbane City Council, the largest public transport bus provider area in Queensland, moved a motion calling on the Council to support residents who oppose these bus cuts and to reject the Queensland Government's planned bus route cuts; and
  - (c) the Brisbane City Council rejected the Queensland Government's planned local bus route cuts.
- 22 **HUMAN RIGHTS IN BANGLADESH:** Resumption of debate (*from 18 March 2013*) on the motion of Mr Husic—That this House:
- (1) notes the tremendous contributions of Australia's Bangladeshi community;
  - (2) shows concern at reports of human rights violations in Bangladesh, and claims that political activists and journalists are being targeted for persecution, abuse and physical violence; and
  - (3) encourages the Australian Government to engage with the Bangladeshi Government to progress democratic reform within that country.
- 23 **MIGRATION AMENDMENT (REINSTATEMENT OF TEMPORARY PROTECTION VISAS) BILL 2013** (*Mr Morrison*): Second reading—Resumption of debate (*from 18 March 2013*).
- 24 **HUMAN RIGHTS IN VIETNAM:** Resumption of debate (*from 18 March 2013*) on the motion of Mr Hayes—That this House:
- (1) notes that:
    - (a) there are reports of human rights violations in the Socialist Republic of Vietnam (SRV) including evidence of continued house detention and imprisonment of notable human rights activists including the Nobel Peace Prize nominee the Most Venerable Thich Quang Do, Patriarch of the Unified Buddhist Church of Vietnam Reverend Nguyen Van Ly, from the Vietnamese Catholic Church Dr Nguyen Dan Que, Jurist Dr Cu Huy Ha Vu, and a popular young peace songwriter Vo Minh Tri (known as Viet Khang);
    - (b) the Vietnam Government's treatment of human rights activists, including the recent trial and conviction of 14 human rights activists in January 2013, appears to be inconsistent with Vietnam's obligations under the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, as well as the provisions of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights relating to freedom of expression and due process;
    - (c) trade union organisers Doan Huy Chuong, Do Thi Minh Hanh and Nguyen Hoang Quoc Hung have spent more than two and a half years in custody convicted for 'national security' charges which emanated from their involvement in organising workers at a shoe factory;
    - (d) despite the SRV being a signatory to the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, human rights activists say that they are often denied a fair trial and prevented from defending themselves or calling upon witnesses for their defence; and
    - (e) on 10 December 2012, a petition was handed to the Australian Government as part of the Million Hearts, One Voice Campaign, containing more than 15,000 signatures from local Vietnamese communities in Australia, and more than 135,000 signatures worldwide, drawing attention to the ongoing human rights violations in Vietnam; and
  - (2) calls on the Australian Government to:
    - (a) take all appropriate steps to convey to the Vietnamese Government that Australia expects Vietnam to honour the undertakings it freely entered into when it became a member of the United Nations and a signatory to the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights;
    - (b) continue Australia's engagement in bilateral and multilateral contexts with Vietnam on human rights; and
    - (c) ensure that the matters contained in this motion are brought to the attention of the 2013 Australia Vietnamese Human Rights dialogue.
- 25 **SELF-MANAGED SUPERANNUATION:** Resumption of debate (*from 18 March 2013*) on the motion of Mr S. P. Jones—That this House:
- (1) notes:
    - (a) the growth of self-managed superannuation schemes investment structures by Australians seeking to grow their retirement savings;
    - (b) that there is \$1.4 trillion in Australian superannuation assets;
    - (c) self-managed superannuation funds are the largest single sector in superannuation; and
    - (d) the severe hardship caused to investors in Trio Capital, which collapsed as a result of fraudulent activity and which was the largest superannuation fraud in Australian history, with around \$176 million lost or missing;



- (2) acknowledges that while investors in the Australian Prudential Regulation Authority (APRA) regulated superannuation funds were eligible for compensation through a member-funded levy under Part 23 of the *Superannuation Industry (Supervision) Act 1993*, no such member-funded compensation scheme exists for investors in self-managed superannuation schemes;
  - (3) notes the legal and resource limitations regarding supervision and detection of fraud by government regulators and prosecutors such as the APRA, Australian Securities and Investments Commission and Australian Federal Police in respect of failed offshore financial investment vehicles; and
  - (4) calls on the:
    - (a) self-managed superannuation sector and policy makers to work together to achieve consensus on the establishment of a member-funded compensation scheme for self-managed superannuation scheme investors who have been subject to fraud; and
    - (b) Government to work with regulators to enhance fraud detection and prevention in the superannuation system.
- 26 **TAX REFORM:** Resumption of debate (*from 18 March 2013*) on the motion of Mr Oakeshott—That this House:
- (1) recognises the need for comprehensive tax reform to maximise the standard of living for Australians for the next 50 years; and
  - (2) encourages the Treasurer to:
    - (a) release a 10 year road-map for comprehensive tax reform as a standalone Budget Paper as part of the 2013-14 Budget, and
    - (b) include reform for consideration beyond the 4 year forward estimates period.
- 27 **COSTED POLICIES:** Resumption of debate (*from 18 March 2013*) on the motion of Dr Leigh—That this House:
- (1) notes that:
    - (a) a bipartisan parliamentary report recommended the creation of the Parliamentary Budget Office, which is now operational having passed Parliament;
    - (b) the Australian people deserve a proper policy debate in 2013, with all parties presenting properly costed policies; and
    - (c) the updated information contained in the Pre-election Economic and Fiscal Outlook will not affect the cost of most policies, and therefore release of fully costed policies should not be delayed until then; and
  - (2) calls on all parties to have their policies costed consistent with the Charter of Budget Honesty, and release them to the Australian people in enough time to have a well-informed debate.
- 28 **SCHOOL EDUCATION:** Resumption of debate (*from 11 February 2013*) on the motion of Ms Rishworth—That this House:
- (1) acknowledges the important work done by Mr David Gonski AC in conducting the first review into school funding and school education in almost 40 years;
  - (2) recognises the transformative power of education and the importance of ensuring that we have a school system that provides all Australian children with a real chance to reach their full potential;
  - (3) supports the principles emerging from this review which have been incorporated into the Government's National Plan for School Improvement, including the need to deliver:
    - (a) a fairer school funding system based on the needs of every student in every classroom;
    - (b) more support for schools and students who need it most;
    - (c) quality teaching in every classroom;
    - (d) more power in the hands of school principals; and
    - (e) more information about school performance for parents and the community; and
  - (4) recognises that the National Plan for School Improvement will build on the reforms the Government has already delivered to ensure every Australian school is a great school, including:
    - (a) the construction of new and upgraded facilities at around 9500 schools;
    - (b) delivering record funding to support students with disability; and
    - (c) working with States and Territories to deliver a national curriculum.
- 29 **IRAN:** Resumption of debate (*from 11 February 2013*) on the motion of Mr Simpkins—That this House:
- (1) notes that:
    - (a) the Islamic Republic of Iran will conduct Presidential elections on June 14 (Khordad 24 on the Iranian calendar) of 2013;

- (b) within Iran, political activists, journalist, and political opposition leaders are imprisoned, and often tortured, for attempting to express their freedom of speech, political and media freedom, and for attempting to hold their government accountable for its actions; and
  - (c) Iran continues to refuse international inspectors free and unfettered access to its nuclear program and this raises suspicions that it is seeking to develop nuclear weapons;
- (2) recognises that:
- (a) the upcoming Iranian elections will see Mahmoud Ahmadinejad replaced as President by another Supreme Leader endorsed candidate;
  - (b) political prisoners being held in violation of human rights must be released as a first step towards holding free and fair elections;
  - (c) Iran's potential acquisition of nuclear weapons poses a serious threat to the Middle Eastern region, and especially to Israel, and could lead to nuclear proliferation; and
  - (d) the Government's decision in sending two senior officials to the Non-Aligned Movement (NAM) in Iran in August has potentially undermined efforts to isolate the nation, with Iran's Supreme Leader viewing the participation of nations from around the world at the NAM in Iran as affirmation of sanction failure and as a level of endorsement for Iran; and
- (3) calls for the:
- (a) release of political prisoners in Iran in order to take a step towards the nation conducting legitimate elections, and as an attempt to begin to resolve some of Iran's human rights issues; and
  - (b) taking of all possible steps to increase sanctions and isolate the regime and pressure it to allow free and unfettered access to International Atomic Energy Agency inspectors. (*On 14 February 2013, the Selection Committee recommended that this order of the day be voted on.*)
- 30 **CHARCOT-MARIE-TOOTH DISEASE:** Resumption of debate (*from 26 November 2012*) on the motion of Mr S. P. Jones—That this House:
- (1) notes that:
- (a) Charcot-Marie-Tooth disease (CMT) is the most common form of inherited motor and sensory neuropathy;
  - (b) there is no cure for CMT and while most sufferers live a normal lifespan, many do so with severe disabilities;
  - (c) estimates are that around one in every 2,500 Australians is affected by CMT;
  - (d) while CMT is more common than diseases such as Muscular Dystrophy, there is a low level of community awareness of CMT, particularly amongst Indigenous Australians;
  - (e) genetic counselling and pre-implantation genetic diagnosis means that those carrying the CMT gene can now conceive without the 50 per cent risk of passing CMT to their offspring; and
  - (f) despite the advances, detection and genetic counselling, low awareness and detection of CMT means that this disease is still spreading to future generations, when it could be stopped;
- (2) notes the need for more investment for research into the cause, care and cure of CMT; and
- (3) as a first step, calls on the Government to provide funding for projects which will lead to the eradication of CMT.
- 31 **WHITE RIBBON DAY:** Resumption of debate (*from 26 November 2012*) on the motion of Mr Hayes—That this House:
- (1) notes that:
- (a) 25 November is observed as White Ribbon Day, a day aimed at preventing violence against women through a nation-wide campaign to raise public awareness of the issue; and
  - (b) the current statistics indicate that one in three women will experience physical violence and one in five will experience sexual violence over their lifetime;
- (2) encourages:
- (a) all Australian men to challenge the attitudes and behaviours that allow violence to continue, by joining the 'My Oath Campaign' and taking the oath: 'I swear never to commit, excuse or remain silent about violence against women'; and
  - (b) Members to show their support for the principals of the White Ribbon Day by taking the oath and wearing a white ribbon or wristband on the day; and
- (3) acknowledges the high economic cost of violence against women and their children, estimated to be \$13.6 billion in 2008-09 and, should no action be taken, the cost will be an estimated \$14.6 billion in 2021-22.

- 32 **BATTLE OF EUREKA:** Resumption of debate (*from 26 November 2012*) on the motion of Dr Leigh—That this House:
- (1) recognises that:
    - (a) the Battle of Eureka:
      - (i) was a key moment in Australian democracy;
      - (ii) called for basic democratic rights, including broadening the franchise and removing the property qualification to stand for the Legislative Council;
      - (iii) inspired subsequent movements in Australian history, including female suffrage and the Australian Republican Movement; and
      - (iv) demanded changes to make mining taxation more equitable, with the revenue to be spent on improvements to local infrastructure; and
    - (b) the importance of the Battle of Eureka is to be commemorated by the Museum of Australian Democracy at Eureka in Ballarat, partly funded by the Australian Government in recognition of its national significance; and
  - (2) encourages all Australians to remember and respect the Battle of Eureka by:
    - (a) visiting the Museum of Australian Democracy at Eureka to learn about the history of the Battle of Eureka and its effect on modern democracy; and
    - (b) flying the Eureka Flag on 3 December each year in its memory.
- 33 **QUEENSLAND RECREATIONAL FISHING PROGRAMS:** Resumption of debate (*from 26 November 2012*) on the motion of Ms Livermore—That this House:
- (1) opposes the Queensland Government’s gutting of Sunfish and major recreational fishing programs;
  - (2) notes the continued efforts by the Liberal National Party (LNP) in Queensland and nationally to undermine recreational fishing by redefining, then cutting frontline services;
  - (3) notes that:
    - (a) before the Queensland election, Premier Newman said the public service had ‘nothing to fear’ from a new LNP government; and
    - (b) Federal Minister Ludwig has written on behalf of Sunfish Queensland to his counterpart, requesting urgent advice on the destructive cuts;
  - (4) strongly supports recreational fishers;
  - (5) calls on the Queensland Government to restore funding as a matter of urgency; and
  - (6) notes the Federal Coalition’s failure to act despite the Leader of the Opposition being fully briefed on the Queensland Government’s budget cuts before they were announced.
- 34 **INDEXATION OF BRITISH PENSIONS:** Resumption of debate (*from 29 October 2012*) on the motion of Ms Rishworth—That this House:
- (1) notes the significant impact of the United Kingdom Government’s refusal to index pensions allocated to British expatriates living in Australia under the United Kingdom’s National Insurance Fund;
  - (2) recognises that:
    - (a) affected British pensioners have made contributions to this scheme;
    - (b) British pensions for expatriates continue to be indexed in numerous other countries including the United States of America and within the European Union, but are frozen in mostly former Commonwealth countries, including Australia, Canada, New Zealand and South Africa; and
    - (c) the United Kingdom Government’s:
      - (i) current policy discriminates in its treatment of its expatriate pensioners depending on their country of residence; and
      - (ii) unfair and discriminatory policy has resulted in the erosion of the purchasing power of British pensions for more than 250,000 British pensioners living in Australia;
  - (3) acknowledges:
    - (a) that through the Australian pension system, the Australian Government provides more than \$100 million each year to recipients of a British pension living in Australia, which helps supplement the shortfall created by the United Kingdom Government’s frozen pension policy; and
    - (b) the ongoing efforts of the Australian Government in making repeated representations to the United Kingdom Government, calling on it to address the issue of frozen pensions for British expatriates living in Australia;
  - (4) commends the Minister for Families, Community Services and Indigenous Affairs for her continued efforts in raising the issue with the United Kingdom Government, most recently during her meeting with the United Kingdom Secretary of State for Work and Pensions; and

- (5) calls on the United Kingdom Government to treat recipients of a British pension equitably by fairly indexing entitlements regardless of where they choose to retire, so that British pensioners can receive the full benefits they deserve.

35 **SRI LANKAN ASYLUM SEEKERS:** Resumption of debate (*from 29 October 2012*) on the motion of Mr Husic—That this House:

- (1) with deep concern, proposals being advanced to automatically return any Sri Lankan national seeking asylum in Australia; and
- (2) that:
  - (a) this is a policy that would target only one group of asylum seekers originating from only one particular country;
  - (b) the automatic return of Sri Lankan nationals without the processing of their claims for asylum fails to comply with the Refugee Convention; and
  - (c) if enacted, the policy would forcibly return asylum seekers to a country that is not a party to the Refugee Convention.
