Guidelines are to be developed to assist Centrelink officers with their assessments.				
	 Establish a \$3 million per year fees scheme to enable payments for artists performing, exhibiting or speaking about their works. Invest an additional \$1 million per year into the existing ArtStart program that provides business training and financial support to those just starting out in their artistic trade. Restore the Parliament's arts procurement policy to require preference for point of sale acquisitions from young and emerging Australian artists. This is a redirection of existing funds, so is not expected to have any additional budgetary impact. 				

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	 Increasing funding for <i>Playing Australia</i>, to administer a greater level of touring grants. We will lift the fund by \$2 million per year from 1 July 2014 until it reaches a threshold of \$10 million when it will be indexed annually. <i>Playing Australia</i> currently receives \$6.8 million. \$5 million per year for three years from 1 July 2014 for a <i>Arts Research and Development Fund</i>. Remove globally touring arts businesses from the 'in Australia' rule so that they will be come tax exempt entities. This has previously been costed at a negligible and unlisted cost to the budget.
