Dissenting Report by Labor Senators

- 1.1 Labor Senators provide the following dissenting report on Red Tape (Occupational Licensing).
- 1.2 Labor Senators reject the premise of the report that occupational licensing reform should start with a presumption against licensing. The inquiry heard strong evidence that occupational licensing is beneficial and necessary to ensure the quality of work performed and the safety of both workers and consumers.
- 1.3 Labor Senators consider that the holding of a licence also sends a powerful signal to consumers, as to the quality and safety of a provider or service.
- 1.4 Labor Senators believe that a tripartite system, involving government, business and union representatives, is best placed to consider the quality, skill and safety needs that are inherent in licensing arrangements, and complemented by a risk-based regulatory approach.
