Mr Cotterell: A few things about the government's election commitment. The election commitment was to roll out the urgent care clinics through existing GP clinics through community health centres, which is the approach being taken in the ACT, or Aboriginal community controlled health services. That is the first thing to say. Senator DAVID POCOCK: So GP-led wasn't in the guidelines? Mr Cotterell: I will come to the guidelines. The guidelines envisage that they'll usually be GP-led but have room for different models depending on the circumstances of the local community. As you say, in the ACT, the GP FTE to population ratio is lower than in many other parts of Australia. That was one of the elements considered. Senator DAVID POCOCK: Would it not have been a good idea to say, 'Maybe we need some more GPs in the ACT?' Mr Cotterell: Part of the issue is that we can't magic-up GPs.
