Ceduna Aboriginal Corporation	Youth Hub Mentoring program/Community Bus: School attendance for children who are ineligible for free school bus services, promoting greater community participation, access to support services, and allowing people to reach home rather than staying in town. The bus is co-funded by the South Australian State Government. Youth Hub Mentoring Program runs a number of activities including after school and holiday care; summer sports; family fun days and community mentoring. The Hub mentors young people to become youth support workers and aims to increase the participation of family members to support their children in positive social activities.
Scotdesco Aboriginal Corporation	The Family Safety Women’s Engagement project: Coordinates and facilitates a regular women’s group that provides a safe and culturally sensitive space for Aboriginal women in Scotdesco to come together to discuss local issues and identify priorities for their community.
Koonibba Community Aboriginal Corporation	Youth and Community Engagement: Aims to strengthen youth and community cultural engagement, and support family and community relationships through the delivery of knowledge camps and community nights. The camps focus on intergenerational learning, cultural management and engagement, connection with land, knowledge sharing, and traditional arts and performance.
Oak Valley (Maralinga) Aboriginal Corporation	Youth and Wellbeing program: Delivers activities to develop children’s social and cognitive functioning. The sessions will help children learn to play, socialise, establish routines and keep them engaged. Activities are held after school on weekdays with some community events on the weekend.
Yalata Anangu Aboriginal Corporation	Youth and Wellbeing program: Offers after hours school care and school holiday activities, kids club and youth shed, cultural days, camps and community events for children and young people in the Yalata community.
Australian Red Cross Society	Community Hub: Supports participants to engage in economic activity, community interconnectedness, and navigate educational streams to build the skills and abilities necessary for employment pathways. This will assist participants to fully engage in society and lead fulfilling and independent lives.

Oak Valley (Maralinga) Aboriginal Corp	Housing and Community Maintenance project: Will promote ownership and housing responsibilities, and develop critical maintenance of homes, other buildings, and community assets amongst community members to start building a relevant/local workforce within the remote community.
Oak Valley (Maralinga) Aboriginal Corp	Camping on Country Men's Wellbeing Development program: Runs a series of "Camping on Country" outings at Oak Valley, targeted at men in the region, specifically those experiencing issues relating to substance abuse. Two facilitated camps will be held with neighbouring communities invited to participate.
Ceduna Aboriginal Corporation	Land Management Rangers program: Employs, trains and supports local people to: identify and cataloguing plants, protect flora and fauna, land based tourism, undertake seed collection, storage and supply Land Management Rangers will develop a sense of caring for country, upskill and potentially gain employment.
Ceduna Aboriginal Corporation	Employment Hub: Will uplift and upskill participants to become employment ready and identify employment opportunities in the local community.
Ceduna Aboriginal Corporation	Youth Leadership Scoping and Implementation project: Will work across multiple communities to create, adapt and run youth leadership program, with on country components in each community, based on the needs and desires of each community.
Ceduna Aboriginal Corporation	Far West Aboriginal Tourism Development project: Will work collaboratively with Aboriginal organisations and community groups to develop a respectful, culturally considered strategic plan. The Development Officer then implement a Far West Aboriginal Tourism Strategy, creating greater economic opportunities and sustainable jobs.
Scotdesco Aboriginal Corporation	School Camps project: Develops a business model leveraging existing resources, such as camp facilities, to support vulnerable and disadvantaged people on pathways to self-reliance and empowerment. It will grow relevant workforce opportunities for those that are job ready, and provide a pathway for other community members.

The program uses after school diversionary activities and week-end cultural healing trips with elders as a means to engage "at risk" teenagers in the juvenile justice system, affected by domestic violence, at risk of self-harm, substance abuse and low self-esteem or respect.
Ord Valley Aboriginal Health Service (OVAHS)	Aboriginal Health Service: Provides primary health care services to Aboriginal people in the Kununurra region of Western Australia. Preventative and public health programs include maternal and child health, women's health, chronic disease, sexual health, and a social support unit providing mental health and alcohol and other drug services
Waringarri Arts Aboriginal Corporation	The Children and Parent support project: Provides activities that promote and celebrate cultural identity and link at risk youth and others to cultural support, with the aim of supporting the social and cultural wellbeing of disengaged youth, individuals and families. Activities include youth justice and young men's re engagement workshops; youth and community nights; and knowledge and art camps.
Wyndham Early Learning Activity	The Children and Parent support project: Delivers parenting education and support, life skills development and home budgeting skills with the aim of supporting families, strengthening relationships, improving the wellbeing of children and young people, and increasing participation of people in community life.
Anglicare WA	Social and Emotional Wellbeing service: Supports participants to identify and address underlying issues that act as barriers to securing and maintaining employment. People will be supported through a practical and flexible case management approach with a holistic focus on wellbeing, underpinned by an understanding that people need social and emotional wellbeing in order to achieve financial wellbeing.
