The line item 'redesign clusters and student contributions' shows the impacts of reducing the fee clusters from four to three and changing the level of commonwealth and student contributions within those clusters. The savings come about in two ways:

- By shifting the balance of total funding contributions towards students (students pay a greater proportion of the cost of their course); and
- By reducing the total contribution in some courses, such as science (the funding available to teach a course is reduced).
