Answer

Over the period 4 July 2022 to 30 September 2023, Employment Fund expenditure for Workforce Australia Services was \$192.2 million (GST exclusive). This excludes commitments made by providers which are yet to be claimed from the Employment Fund.

There are a range of activities the Department undertakes to assess eligibility of an Employment Fund claim for reimbursement from Workforce Australia Services providers, including through:

- system controls
- program desk top monitoring
- use of data analytics
- targeted assurance activities
- the Continuous Assessment of Payment Integrity
- investigations from tip-offs.

On the basis of the above activities, since 4 July 2022, the compliance rate is approximately 99 per cent. This is due to a focus on the early detection and remediation of non-compliant behaviour.
