I write to correct evidence I provided at the Senate Additional Estimates hearing held on Thursday 17 February 2022.

The Hansard records that in response to a question from Senator Steele-John about a media release by Minister Price on defence reforming its procurement processes that it will reduce the procurement period from four years to 12 months, that I stated "To clarify, the statement really is to reduce to 12 months what it would typically take to get to contract for four years..."

I seek to correct my response to:

"To clarify, the statement really is to reduce $\underline{\mathbf{b}\mathbf{v}}$ 12 months what it would typically take to get to contract for four years..."

I wish to correct this evidence with the following information: When I responded to the question, and initiated it with "To clarify.." I thought I was assisting Senator Steele-John understand that it was a reduction of 12 months off a four year process. I apologise for not making this clear.

The Australian Standard for Defence Contracting (ASDEFCON) and Defence Procurement Review found that for a project that would have previously taken four years to get the point of a contract signature, a reduction of up to 12 months could be made. This is reflected through the review and in the Minister Price media release 27 December 2021.
