





Select committee activity

- Select committee (including joint select committee) activity has recently risen to levels not seen before, requiring the Senate department to support 9 such committees concurrently.
- The table below compares the number of select and joint select committees supported by the Senate Committee Office across the last four parliaments.
- After 8 months of the 46th Parliament, the Committee Office is committed to providing a total of 100 months of secretariat support to select committees, which is more than half of the total support required for the whole of the previous parliament.


• In addition, the Committee Office also supports five joint standing committees.

Staffing

Staffing for 2019-20: At 5 February 2020, there were 62.4 Full Time Equivalent staff in the Committee Office, compared with an average FTE of 65 in 2018-19. This reduction reflects the brief downturn in committee activity as a result of the 2019 election. The Committee Office is currently returning to higher staffing levels to reflect ongoing high levels of committee activity. The following chart shows changes in average staffing levels over time.

Administration

The current annual budget for the Committee Office is approximately \$8.9 million. This includes employee expenses of \$8.5 million and administrative expenses (including secretariat travel, accommodation and venues for hearings) of \$0.4 million. So far in the 2019-20 financial year (as at 31 December 2019), the Committee Office actual expenditure was \$4.311 million.
