Can you outline to me a breakdown of the Indigenous Australians Health Program—IAHP—funding broken down per state and territory? [...]</p> <p>Mr Matthews: [...] Yes, we should be able to provide that. If you bear with me, I probably can provide you with a breakdown of the state and territory spending in here somewhere. It will just take me a couple of minutes to find it. If you give me a couple of minutes to find it, I will come back with that.</p> <p>Senator THORPE: Yes, and I'd like to know particularly how much is for Victoria?</p> <p>Mr Matthews: Yes.</p> <p>p. 52</p> <p>Mr Matthews: Just to follow up on your question—unfortunately probably the one thing I don't have is the state breakdown for that. Obviously, we can have a look at that for you on notice. Just to note, though, that when we do obviously there will be some things in there that do have quirks. An organisation might have its head office in Alice Springs and that's where all the funding goes but its services can be national. All of those things mean that sometimes the figures don't always represent exactly where the services go. It's very difficult to disaggregate that, but we can have a look at what we can provide for you.</p> <p>Senator THORPE: Could you also include in that, on notice, the types of services—primary care, mental, emotional, health, workforce, development, et cetera?</p> <p>Mr Matthews: Yes, we can give you an indication of that.</p> <p>Senator THORPE: Thank you.</p>	Hansard, 26 March 2021, pp. 50, 52

It's \$500,000 for the broad campaign to actually make sure that we've got good translation audio programs and mainstream media buys to target Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.
