




### 1. References—comparison at same point of last 3 Parliaments

## Select committee activity

- Select committee (including joint select committee) activity during the 46<sup>th</sup> Parliament has risen to levels not experienced before, requiring the Senate department to at one point support 12 select committees concurrently. There are currently eight select committees.
- The table below compares the number of select and joint select committees supported by the Senate Committee Office across the last four parliaments.
- From the commencement of the 46<sup>th</sup> Parliament, the Committee Office is committed to providing a total of 246 months of secretariat support to select committees, which is more than the total support required for any previous parliament.



# Staffing

Staffing for 2020-21: At 14 May 2021, there were 75.2 Full Time Equivalent staff in the Committee Office, compared with an average FTE of 64 in 2019-20. Staffing levels reflect the brief downturn in committee activity as a result of the 2019 election and subsequent increase of activity during the 46<sup>th</sup> Parliament. The current staffing level in the Committee Office reflects ongoing high levels of committee activity. The following chart shows changes in average staffing levels over time.

## Administration

The current annual budget for the Committee Office is approximately \$10.2 million. This includes employee expenses of \$10.0 million and administrative expenses (including reduced budget for secretariat travel, accommodation and venues for hearings due to COVID-19) of \$0.2 million. So far in the 2020-21 financial year (as at 30 April 2021), the Committee Office actual expenditure was \$8.1 million.
