## Central Land Council Member Feedback

We've organised a working group of CLC members and collated our feedback for your review.

## Problems with CLC

- Misidentification in family groups.
- They cause division by only consulting with certain TO's (Usually the yes people) in one family and ignore others. Also disrespect Kwerdangul (Do not class them as land owners/officers).
- They don't speak to the right owners, they don't take the right people out to see the country.
- Certainly, no understanding and acknowledgement to traditional owners of respective lands and land trusts by CLC anthropologists and the so called lawyers not even the CEO.
- We don't get enough information in a way that we understand. Why do you
  withhold our own information and keep it confidential.
- They divide our family members. They make us fight. We know who we are they divide us in the wrong way. Not according to our Jukurrpa
- CLC are breaking our Jukurrpa they don't understand it. We don't want other
  groups and people coming into our Jukurrpa they have their own.
   The gatekeepers at clc should be working with us and for us and they should
  - -The gatekeepers at clc should be working with us and for us and they should learn. If you don't understand you shouldn't be in that position.

## Proposed changes to CLC

- Establish all land trusts as new service managers to manage land matters
- We want new people in the land council. We want good people who know how to work properly with Yapa.
- We want to change policies, so our laws are not broken.
- Would like see Anthropologists work with correct TOs. It causes arguments amongst family groups.
- They have well documented family trees going back to the original land claims. Why do not utilise them when dealing with TO's
- Introduce a "Reeducation camp" or Cultural Consultation Committee: A select committee of elders to reinstate cultural/tribal protocols and deliver appropriate cultural consultation to those in need of it. CLC's corporate policies and/or practices should not in any way override or undermine Tribal Law.
- We need to put all gatekeepers at CLC under review.
