Description of the charity's activities and outcomes:

The charitable objective is to help build a nation that leaves no one behind, through an Australia-wide leadership initiative that makes a substantive impact on social inclusion, economic prosperity and equity of access. The Governor-General's Australian Future Leaders program will better prepare, better equip and better connect Australia's future leaders for a more uncertain world by leveraging 65,000 years of collective knowledge and our unique national diversity. Significant financial and support is kind from community focused organisations and individuals who believe that Australia needs a national leadership program has been both committed and expended.
