On 22 October 2020, I gave evidence to the Senate Legal and Constitutional Affairs Legislation Committee during its budget estimates hearings. I gave my evidence by video from Adelaide. In the course of that evidence, the following exchange occurred between Senator Henderson and me:

Senator HENDERSON: Dr Popple, why were you not aware of these social media publications by one of your senior members of staff?

Dr Popple: I'm not on Twitter myself, so I haven't read those tweets—
