## Clarification to Hansard - Additional Budget Estimates hearing on 4 August 2023

The Australian Federal Police appeared at the Additional Budget Estimates hearing on 4 August 2023 as part of the Attorney-General's Portfolio.

In my capacity as acting Deputy Commissioner Crime, I gave evidence to the Senate and I have reviewed the Hansard record. In relation to my testimony I have become aware of the need to amend a response to a question from Senator James Paterson.

The particular reference for correction is on page 32 of the Hansard Transcript in response to a question from Senator Paterson the launch date of *Trace an Object* initiative, I said:

**Mr Nicholls:** Yes, you're 100 per cent correct on that. I can tell you that it was launched on 3 March 2021. I can tell you that Trace an Object has had, as at 3 March, 52,000 visits to its web page. I can also share with you that 570 reports have been received. From those, we've got three investigation leads...

The figures provided in evidence on 4 August 2023 were outdated and taken from the ACCCE's public website. I can advise these statistic s have now been updated to reflect those provided below (as at 31 March 2023).

Therefore, the response is not an accurate reflection of the matter and I am providing the following amendment to the evidence in response to the question:

Mr Nicholls: Yes, you're 100 per cent correct on that. I can tell you that it was launched on 3 March 2021. I can tell you that Trace an Object has had, as at 31 March 2023, 183,664 visits to the dedicated webpages. I can also share with you that 881 reports have been submitted by members of the public relating to objects features on the webpage, which have led to several investigative leads.
