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SENATE QUESTION

QUESTION NUMBER: 4001

Kim Carr asked the following question, upon notice, on 13 August 2021.

With respect to the Administrative Appeals Tribunal and the processing of Freedom of Information requests:

- 1. Since July 2018, has the Tribunal at all times complied with its legal obligations under section 11C of the Freedom of Information Act; if not, how many times has it breached section 11C and why has it failed to comply with its legal obligations.
- 2. In 2018-19, did the Tribunal ever breach its legal obligation under section 11C of the Freedom of Information Act to publish a relevant document (being a document to which section 11C applies) on a website within 10 working days of a person being given access to that document; if so, how many times did the Tribunal breach its legal obligation under section 11C in 2018-19.
- 3. In 2019-20, did the Tribunal ever breach its legal obligation under section 11C of the Freedom of Information Act to publish a relevant document (being a document to which section 11C applies) on a website within 10 working days of a person being given access to that document; if so, how many times did the Tribunal breach its legal obligation under section 11C in 2019-20.
- 4. In 2020-21, did the Tribunal ever breach its legal obligation under section 11C of the Freedom of Information Act to publish a relevant document (being a document to which section 11C applies) on a website within 10 working days of a person being given access to that document; if so, how many times did the Tribunal breach its legal obligation under section 11C in 2020-21.
- 5. On the date that the Tribunal received this question, was the Tribunal in breach of its legal obligation under section 11C of the Freedom of Information Act to publish a relevant document (being a document to which section 11C applies) on a website within 10 working days of a person being given access to that document; if so, as at the date the Tribunal received this question, how many documents had the Tribunal failed to publish on a website in accordance with section 11C.

Senator the Hon Michaelia Cash has provided the following answer to the senator's question:

1. Section 11C of the Freedom of Information Act 1982 (FOI Act) requires an agency to publish information to which that section applies on a website, including by making the information available for downloading from the website or by publishing on the website other details of how the information may be obtained. The Administrative Appeals Tribunal (AAT) does not administer the FOI Act. It is not a matter for the AAT to determine whether or not its own actions conform with the requirements of section 11C of that Act. The AAT has identified, however, that since July 2018 there have been 21 requests for access to documents in relation to which the AAT included information on the FOI disclosure log on its website more than 10 working days after giving a person access to documents. The AAT's processes for publishing

information within the timeframe were not implemented in a timely manner. The AAT has advised that it will review and improve its processes to ensure information is published within the timeframe.

- 2. In 2018–19, there were 8 requests for access to documents in relation to which the AAT included information on the FOI disclosure log more than 10 working days after giving a person access to the documents.
- 3. In 2019–20, there were 2 requests for access to documents in relation to which the AAT included information on the FOI disclosure log more than 10 working days after giving a person access to the documents.
- 4. In 2020-21, there were 10 requests for access to documents in relation to which the AAT included information on the FOI disclosure log more than 10 working days after giving a person access to the documents.
- 5. On 13 August 2021, the date the AAT received this question, there were 12 requests for access to documents in relation to which the AAT had not included information on the FOI disclosure log within 10 working days after giving a person access to the documents. Information in relation to those requests has subsequently been included on the AAT's FOI disclosure log.
