Completed  This recommendation was made in relation to the Restoring the Balance program which was established in 2007. The department has robust processes in place to develop program evaluation strategies. This is evidenced in the recent implementation of the Water for Fodder program which includes a MERI framework and interim report which has recently been released.
	Evaluation of the water purchasing program will commence in November 2020. The program will be evaluated against the program outcomes.
