The intention to negotiate a Darwin City Deal was announced on 26 May 2017 with the Deal signed on 16 November 2018.

- On 1 July 2019, the CSIRO-led Darwin Living was established – made possible by funding from the three levels of government.
- The second Northern Territory Designated Area Migration Agreement commenced on 1 July 2019, which is tailored to address current and emerging labour market shortages.
- The Northern Territory Government established Activate Darwin, in partnership with the private sector, which will be a driver of change to help Darwin realise its potential as an attractive, bustling and connected capital city.
- The Larrakia Hosts program has commenced and has already made great strides in promoting Larrakia culture.
- The Switching on Darwin project was delivered in May 2019 and is currently in the testing and commissioning phase (funded through a Smart Cities and Suburbs Program Grant).
- On 5 September 2019, the Civic and State Square masterplan was released by the Northern Territory Government.
- As at 30 September 2019, relocation of all 10 Australian Public Service positions in the Office of the Registrar of Indigenous Corporations from Canberra to Darwin is completed. This is part of the Supporting the local workforce project, which contains additional components still underway.

The intention to negotiate a Launceston City Deal was a commitment in the 2016 Election. Prior to the Deal being signed, a Launceston hub of the National Institute for Forest Products Innovation was announced on 31 May 2016, with the relocation of the University of Tasmania and the City Heart Project announced on 24 June 2016. The Launceston City Deal was signed on 20 April 2017. Post the Deal being signed, a number of further Australian Government funding commitments have been announced, including:

- \$95 million to improve the health of the Tamar – with funding split 50:50 between the Australian and Tasmanian governments, announced on 16 February 2018;
- \$5 million to upgrade the Youngtown Barracks to support the divestment of Paterson Barracks and \$250,000 to support a business case into a Defence Innovation and Design Precinct, announced on 26 June 2017; and
- \$4.5 million from the Smart Cities and Suburbs Program, which were announced as part of the funding rounds for the Program.

The intention to develop a Townsville City Deal was announced on 13 June 2016, at the same time as the announcement of a funding commitment of \$100m for the North Queensland Stadium. A total of \$250m in Australian Government funding was originally committed to the Deal, following a previous announcement, on 18 May 2016 of \$150m for the Townsville Eastern Access Rail Corridor (TEARC). An MoU for City Deals in Queensland was signed on 10 November 2016, and the Townsville City Deal was signed on 9 December 2016. On 4 September 2018, following a detailed business case that did not support construction of the TEARC at present, it was announced that \$5m of the original \$150m funding commitment would be retained to contribute to the preservation of the TEARC for possible future construction, and \$75m would be reallocated to the Port of Townsville Channel Capacity Upgrade project. On 4 November 2018, it was announced that the remainder of the TEARC funding, together with additional funding, would comprise a commitment of up to \$200m for Stage 2 of the Haughton Pipeline project. This announcement increased total Australian Government funding for the Townsville City Deal to \$381.7m.

The Western Sydney City Deal was signed by the Australian, New South Wales and eight local governments on 4 March 2018 with a 20 year timeframe. These local governments are Blue Mountains, Camden, Campbelltown, Fairfield, Hawkesbury, Liverpool, Penrith and Wollondilly. On 11 March 2019, the Australian Government announced a commitment of \$3.5 billion towards Stage 1 of the North South Rail Link from St Marys to the Western Sydney Aerotropolis via Western Sydney International (Nancy-Bird Walton) Airport. The \$3.5 billion includes the \$50 million for business case development under the City Deal, as well as improvements to Elizabeth Drive and construction of the rail link.
