The committee called:

Department of Employment and Workplace Relations.

Corporate and Enabling Services, Cross-portfolio and general matters

- Update on resolving the underpayment of staff at the department increased number of staff identified as underpaid, legal advice received, use of consultants, engagement with the Fair Work Ombudsman;
- Impact of Future Made in Australia policy on the department;
