

Senate Community Affairs Legislation Committee Budget Estimates 2024–25 Thursday, 6 June 2024 Daily summary

The committee met from 9.00am until 8.30pm.

The Committee called the following agencies of the Health and Aged Care Portfolio:

- Professional Services Review;

Some topics discussed by the committee included:

<u>DoHAC – Outcome 2: Individual Health Benefits</u>

- Bulk-billing, including rates of attendance, incentives, payroll tax;
- General Use Items, including advice around removal from Prescription List;
- National Diabetes Services Scheme, including tender for subsidised products;
- Seventh Community Pharmacy Agreement, including payments;
- Cost of surgery, with particular reference to ACT;
- Payments related to double-dispensed medicines, including the PBS and PBS scripts;
- Freezing of the co-payment on both concessional and non-concessional medicines;
- Medicare rebates for consultations on vaccines;
- Update on medicines listings;
- Access to Neuroblastoma treatment, particularly Difluoromethylornithine (DFMO);
- Treatments to cystic fibrosis for children, particularly early access to Trikafta;
- Insulin Pump Program for Type 1 Diabetes, including its tender process;
- Menopausal hormone therapies;
- Workshop supply services of Copper IUD's and how they can be subsidised;
- Introduction of the new Medicare Benefits Schedule (MBS) item for endometriosis and pelvic pain;
- Provision of \$377.3 million funding for opioid dependence treatment;
- Health Technology Assessment Policy and Methods Review;
- Consultancy in relation to the Spinal Cord Stimulator review of comparative clinical and cost effectiveness; and
- Amendments to the MBS pathology items in line with the recommendations of the MBS Review Task Force.
