






Sectorial Share of Employment




Impact of Energy

Since 2008, Energy cost increased by 120%


Townsville further impact by transmission costs + lack of retail competition




Unemployment - Townsville


Employment Change (Census) - Townsville



SEIFA Impact - Townsville





Federal Reforms

Taxation Reform

- Zone Tax Offset Review, recognising disadvantage and incentivising regional living

Fiscal reform

- Horizontal Fiscal Equalisation – A guaranteed share of Federal Revenue (1%) with increased recognition of regional disadvantage
- Decentralised and divulged decision making (APS reform)
- Increased investment into regional communities & economies (Budget Fair Share)
- Supported Regional immigration and migration schemes
- Improved data availability
- Increased trade capacity and promotion

Regulatory reform

- Sustainable Energy Policies that balance sustainability, reliability and price
- Energy Retail Competition in Regional Areas
- Regulatory reform of insurance markets to promote competition (availability) & equitable pricing
