COMMUNITY CONSULTATION REPORT
RAAF BASE LEARMONTH REDEVELOPMENT ENABLING KC-30A
OPERATIONS PROJECT

1. The RAAF Base Learmonth Redevelopment Enabling KC-30A Operations Project (the Project) was referred to the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works on 28 November 2023. The Project proposes to deliver facilities and infrastructure at RAAF Base Learmonth near Exmouth, Western Australia.
2. This letter is to inform the Committee of the nature and extent of community consultation that has been undertaken by the Department of Defence for the proposed works. The aim of the consultation is to ensure local communities and other stakeholders are:
 - a. well informed about Project details through effective and proven communication channels; and
 - b. provided the opportunity to raise any concerns or issues, or to seek further information, so that, wherever feasible, Defence can address these within the Project.
3. The following stakeholder and community consultation activities have been delivered in accordance with the Project's comprehensive Community and Stakeholder Engagement Plan:
 - a. advertising community information sessions in relevant local newspapers in the North West and Pilbara regions – these details are included in the example advertisement shown at **Annex A**;
 - b. one community information session was held on 19 December 2023 in Exmouth, Western Australia. The type of information Defence presented to the public is shown at **Annex B**, and the level of attendance is provided at **Annex C**.
 - c. inviting key stakeholders, including the State Member of Parliament, the Shire of Exmouth, and local community and business groups, to inform them about the Project – an example of the invitation that was sent out is provided at **Annex D**.

4. A list of all stakeholders engaged by the Project, including the status of each engagement, is provided at **Annex E**.

5. Information about the proposed works was well received at the community information session and feedback to date has been supportive. Defence has not been made aware of any objections to the proposed works. A summary of topics and key issues raised during the community information sessions is provided at **Annex F**.

6. Comments raised by members of the community were mainly focused on:

- a. the impact of the proposed works on the operation of the civilian airport that is located at RAAF Base Learmonth and associated airline flight schedules;
- b. accommodation arrangements for the construction workforce, noting the limited supply of local housing and short-stay accommodation in the Exmouth region;
- c. impacts from construction traffic; and
- d. opportunities for local industry.

7. Consultation activities have concluded. Defence will provide a briefing to Federal, State and Local Members of Government contacted during the consultation process should they request one. These ongoing activities will be further advised at the upcoming Hearing.

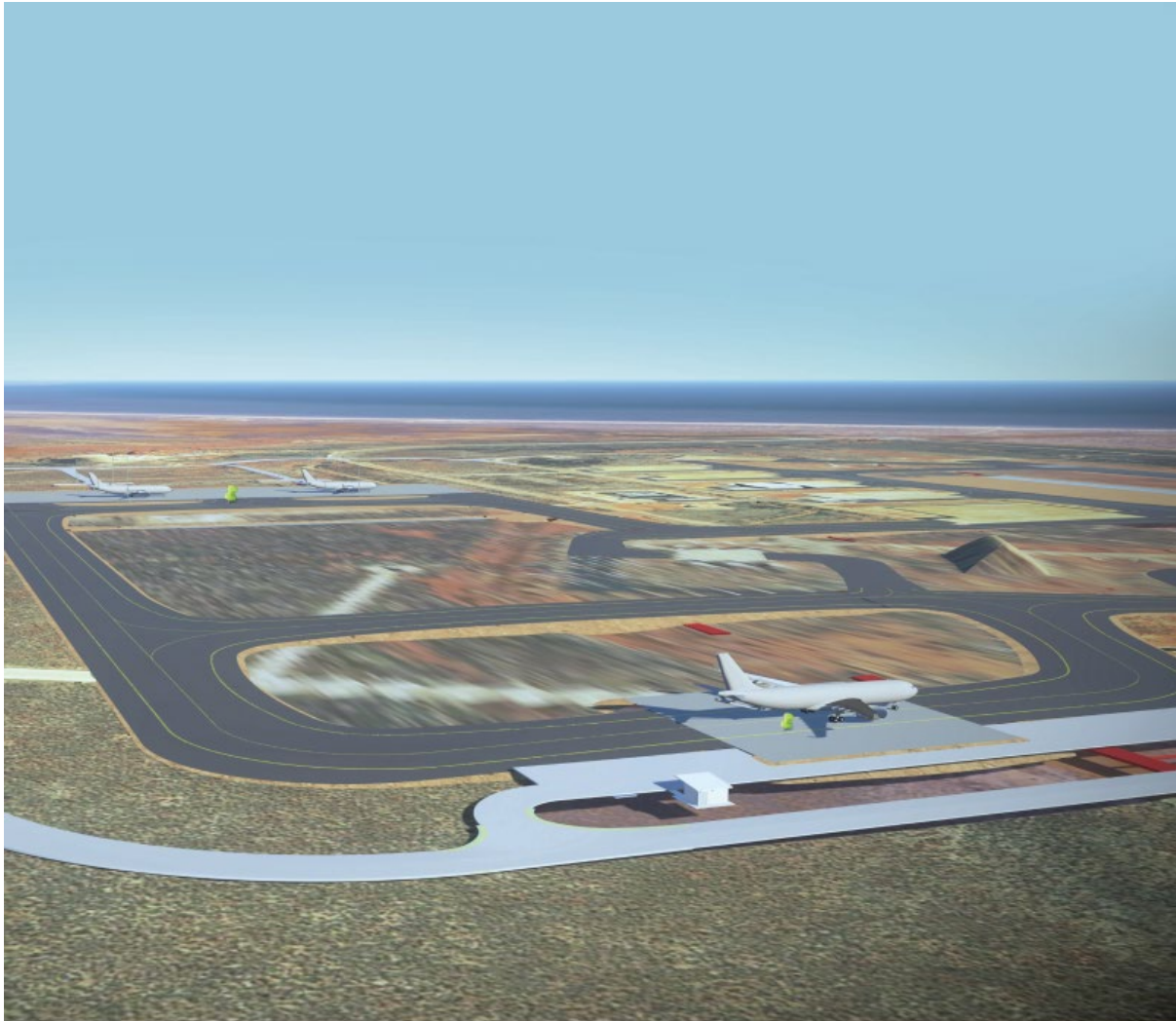

The workforce is planned to be accommodated in temporary accommodation that will be located on the Base. This decision was based upon the limited local accommodation and the potential for disrupted access during rain events. The planned workers' accommodation camp in Exmouth was considered; however it is not likely to be completed in time to support the proposed construction timeframe, will not be large enough for the anticipated workforce and does not include a dining facility.

Will the works have an impact on the civilian terminal and the lease the Shire has with Defence? • Defence Response. The Project plans to upgrade the parallel taxiway to function as a temporary runway whilst the runway works are being undertaken. The airport operator will need to notify airlines of the changed landing and take-off arrangements. • Workers' Accommodation. Where will the construction workforce be housed and has Defence considered the proposed development in Exmouth to provide a longer term legacy? Mr Lewis also outlined an approved housing development in Exmouth which Defence could leverage by funding the construction of houses for use by the workforce. • Defence Response. The workforce is planned to be accommodated in temporary accommodation on the Base. This decision was made because of the limited local accommodation and potential for disrupted access during rain events. The proposed workers' accommodation in Exmouth was considered, however is not likely to be built in time to support the proposed construction timeframes. The Project was previously unaware of the approved housing development. • Power. Mr Lewis outlined the constraints of power supplies to Exmouth, and the Shire's longer-term plan for a large scale solar and battery system to meet the town's needs. • Defence Response. The Project is not planning for any increase in power supplied to the Base. • Water. Mr Lewis outlined constraints on additional water in the region and the Shire's investigation of desalination to meet the town's growing water needs. He queried whether Defence could co-fund a desalination plant in conjunction with the State Government. • Defence Response. Defence is currently undertaking a study to understand how water will be provided during

Desalination may be considered but could result in potential delays due to necessary environmental approvals.</p> <p>6 December 2023. The letter also outlined the request made to the Shire's airport operator to confirm status of consultation with the airlines regarding operational changes during construction.</p> <p>6 December 2023. The temporary runway will support operations up to Boeing 737-8 aircraft, which is the largest aircraft currently servicing Exmouth. The aerodrome is an emergency diversion airfield for very large aircraft operated by civilian airlines flying international routes. The aerodrome will not be able to support these diversions during the works on the main runway. Airlines will be notified of this temporary change and they will need to undertake risk assessments and if required amend emergency procedures.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Civilian Flights. Has Defence made representations to QANTAS regarding the Project and outlined the need for additional flights to Exmouth? • Defence Response. Defence's contractor (CPB Pty Ltd) is seeking to engage QANTAS for more flights and the use of larger aircraft to support their Fly-In Fly-Out workforce. Defence has not separately sought to influence operational decisions by QANTAS. • Workers' Accommodation. Where will the construction workforce be housed and has Defence considered the proposed workers' accommodation in Exmouth? • Defence Response. The workforce is planned to be accommodated in temporary accommodation that will be constructed on the Base. This decision was based upon the limited local accommodation and the potential for disrupted access during rain events. The planned workers' accommodation camp was considered, however it is not likely to be built in time to support the proposed construction timeframes, will not be large enough for the anticipated workforce and does not include a dining facility. • Local Employment Opportunities. How will Defence ensure local businesses are engaged during the project? • Defence Response. Defence has standard contractual clauses that require Contractors to achieve a nominated percentage of the contract value to be expended in the local community. Defence's contractor (CPB Pty Ltd) is a member of the Exmouth Chamber of Commerce and Industry and is working with the Chamber's CEO to ensure local businesses are engaged in construction. Defence maintains a corporate scorecard of compliance against nominated local spending targets and CPB's performance will be considered in future procurements. • Training Opportunities. How will Defence support local training and upskilling during the Project? • Defence Response. CPB has undertaken to maximise

	training opportunities through engagement with local TAFEs and businesses. This undertaking will be contractually enforceable if CPB is engaged to undertake construction.
Nghanhurra Thanardi Garbu Aboriginal Corporation	<p>16 August 2023. Defence briefed the Nghanhurra Thanardi Garbu Aboriginal Corporation (NTGAC) Board on the Project. The Board was appreciative of the brief and directed their legal representatives to engage with Defence to establish an agreement for the Project. The NTGAC Legal Advisor outlined their inability to achieve this due to the changes occurring with respect to WA Legislation.</p> <p>25 October 2023. Defence gave the NTGAC Board a tour of the Base focusing on the development areas. The Board indicated no concerns with the proposal, however they sought further engagement to ensure any heritage values in the ‘greenfield’ areas were considered. Local Industry Participation Will there be opportunities for local industry participation in the proposed works?	Local Resident	Defence will promote opportunities for small and medium local enterprises through construction trade packages that will provide employment opportunities in the Exmouth region. The contractor has confirmed its commitment to maximising opportunities for local industry participation to deliver regional economic benefits. The contractor will also be obliged to meet targets for local industry participation as set out in the contract.
Materials Delivery How will construction materials and fuel will be delivered to site?	Local Resident	Construction supplies and fuel will be transported by road from either Perth or northern ports. Construction material will come from a variety of quarries in the wider Exmouth region. The contractor is currently undertaking a traffic study to understand the impacts of this construction traffic.
Construction Traffic How will the Project manage issues such as road use and construction traffic?	State Government	To reduce the impacts of construction traffic and to improve safety, Defence will construct intersection improvements on the main road to Exmouth. The proposed improvements include widening of the main road to provide dedicated slip and turning lanes at the northern entrance to the Base.
Power and Water Where will the Project get the water and power from?	State Government	Defence is currently undertaking studies to confirm the water and power requirements and their availability for the construction works. The initial studies indicate that the Project will use the Base's existing bore water and power supplies.
Workforce Size What size of workforce is expected to be involved in the construction of the Project?	Local Resident	The Project is anticipating a peak workforce of approximately 300 people.
Construction Timeline When is the construction expected to commence?	Local Resident	Subject to Parliamentary approval, construction is expected to commence in mid-2024 and be completed by the end of 2028.
