RAAF BASE DARWIN MID TERM REFRESH PROJECT – COMMUNITY CONSULTATION REPORT

1. The RAAF Base Darwin Mid Term Refresh Project was referred to the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works on 15 November 2023. The project proposes to deliver facilities and infrastructure on the Base, including substantial upgrades of two existing base entrances along the Stuart Highway.
2. This letter is to inform the Committee of the nature and extent of community consultation that has been undertaken by the Department of Defence for these proposed works. The aim of the consultation is to ensure local communities and other stakeholders are:
 - a. well informed about the project through effective and proven communication channels; and
 - b. provided the opportunity to raise any concerns or issues, or to seek further information so that, wherever feasible, Defence could address these in the proposed works.
3. The following stakeholder and community consultation activities have been delivered in accordance with the project's comprehensive community engagement strategy:
 - a. Community information sessions were advertised in relevant local newspapers in the Darwin (NT) region and a project email address was established to receive submissions and questions about the project. These details are included in the example advertisement shown at **Annex A**.
 - b. Community information sessions were held in Darwin on 23 and 24 October 2023.
 - c. The type of information Defence presented to the public is shown at **Annex B**, and the level of attendance is provided at **Annex C**.
 - d. Key stakeholders, including Federal and State Members of Government, and business groups were invited to receive a personal briefing about the project. An example of the invitation that was sent out is at Annex D, and a list of all stakeholders engaged by the project, including the status of each engagement, is provided at Annex E.
4. A summary of topics and key issues raised during community information sessions is provided at **Annex F**.

5. Information about the proposed works was well received at the community information sessions and feedback to date has been constructive and of broad interest to local subcontractors within the immediate Darwin region in opportunities on the project. Defence has not been made aware of any objections to the proposed works.

6. Consultation activities have concluded. Defence will provide a briefing to Federal, State and Local Members of Government contacted during the consultation process should they request one.

The Department of Defence will conduct a community information forum to outline the proposed construction works associated with the project: RAAF Darwin Mid Term Refresh Project. Subject to Parliamentary Approval, the works will be delivered from 2024 through to 2026 at RAAF Base Darwin, Northern Territory.

The proposed works include a new high-capacity main entrance, an upgraded entrance for heavy vehicle access, and capacity, condition and compliance upgrades to the potable water, firefighting water and sewer networks. Most construction works will be conducted within the Base, while the enhancement of the two entrances will improve trafficability along the Stuart Highway through additional queuing capacity to the existing main entry and a new signalised intersection at Bombing Road. The designs of each of these entrances have been closely coordinated with the Department of Infrastructure, Planning and Logistics.

Information about the proposed works will be available at the forum with representatives from the Department of Defence available to answer any questions.



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Project Aim and Overview

Aim

- Project aims to address safety and capacity concerns associated with the current Base entrances, as well as prioritised capacity, condition and compliance upgrades of engineering services at RAAF Darwin.

Overview

- RAAF Darwin is one of the Air Force's main forward operating bases
- The Base supports major exercises and operations within the north
- Shares its runway with Darwin International airport
- RAAF Darwin hosts an extended deployment of US Marine Corps personnel and their aircraft under the US Force Posture Initiative

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Facilities Project Context

- 2020 Defence Strategic update and 2020 Force Structure Plan highlighted the need to enhance northern Defence capability as an integral part of Australia's Defence strategy
- 2023 Defence Strategic Review also urges for the upgrade and development of Australia's northern bases, improving the ability of the Australian Defence force to operate from Northern Australia.
- This project directly support Defence's strategic objectives by reinvesting in engineering services and associated facilities and infrastructure to improve the Base's ability to cater for surge activity.

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Current Facilities Challenges

Main Entrance – Currently served by a single-entry point on Billeroy Road off Stuart Highway. Multiple deficiencies including:

- Safety and congestion issues
- Vehicle queuing issues during peak timings
- Inadequate passive and electronic security systems
- No vehicle rejection capacity
- Inadequate visitor parking or safe pedestrian access to pass office
- Inadequate staff facilities and visitor/contractor areas within PO
- Main access is via Amaroo Road entering directly into working accommodation precincts

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Current Facilities Challenges



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Current Facilities Challenges

Heavy Vehicle Entrance – Existing heavy vehicle entrance at Bombing road with an unmanned gate. Multiple challenges include:

- No right hand turn on Stuart Hwy where heavy vehicles can safely queue prior to turning into the Base
- No acceleration lane from Bombing Road onto the Stuart Hwy to enable vehicles to safely exit the base
- No signalisation of the current intersection for the safety of vehicle movements at the intersection
- No vehicle reject capability
- Inadequate passive and electronic security systems
- No facilities for security staff during entrance usage

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Current Facilities Challenges



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Current Facilities Challenges

Potable Water Network - existing potable water network is in poor physical condition and has hydraulic capacity constraints due to high friction losses. Additional compliance issues include water leakage from the system and poor water quality attributed to the age and deterioration of the network.

Firefighting Network - existing FF network is in poor physical condition with friction losses throughout the network. Additional compliance issues such as water leaks, quality and lack of pressure that are attributed to the age, connectivity and deterioration of the network.

Sewer Network – the existing base lacks sufficient sewer capacity to support the ongoing operation and future development of the Base. It also has existing compliance, condition issues that need to be addressed.

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Proposed Facilities Solution

The essential requirements of the Project include:

1. A replacement high-capacity main entrance for the Base
2. An upgraded entrance for heavy vehicle access to the base for explosive ordnance and fuel deliveries
3. Capacity, condition and compliance upgrades to the potable water network
4. Capacity, condition and compliance upgrades to the firefighting network
5. Capacity, condition and compliance upgrades to the sewer network

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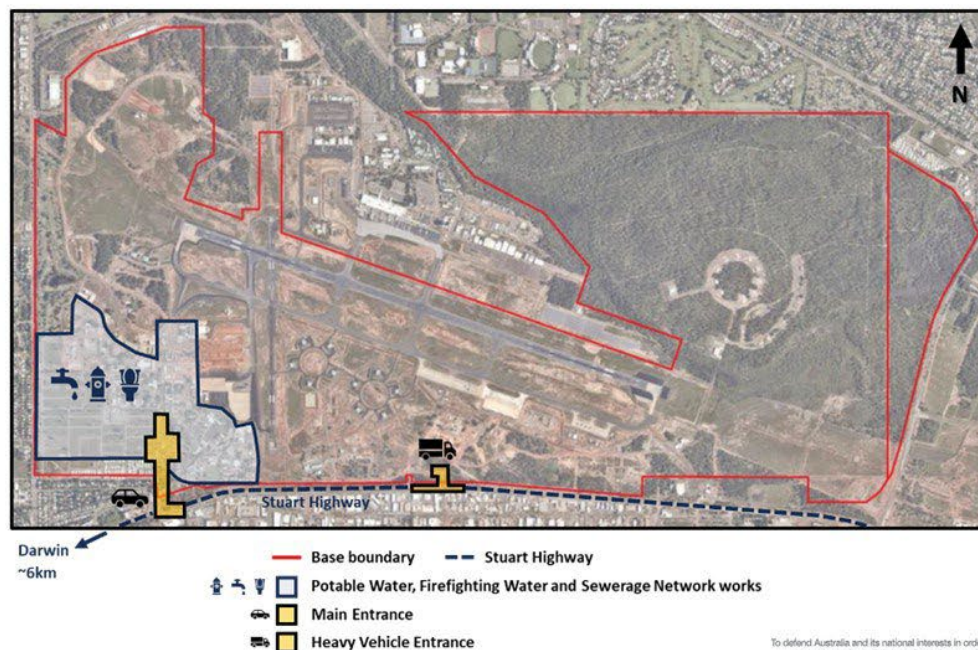

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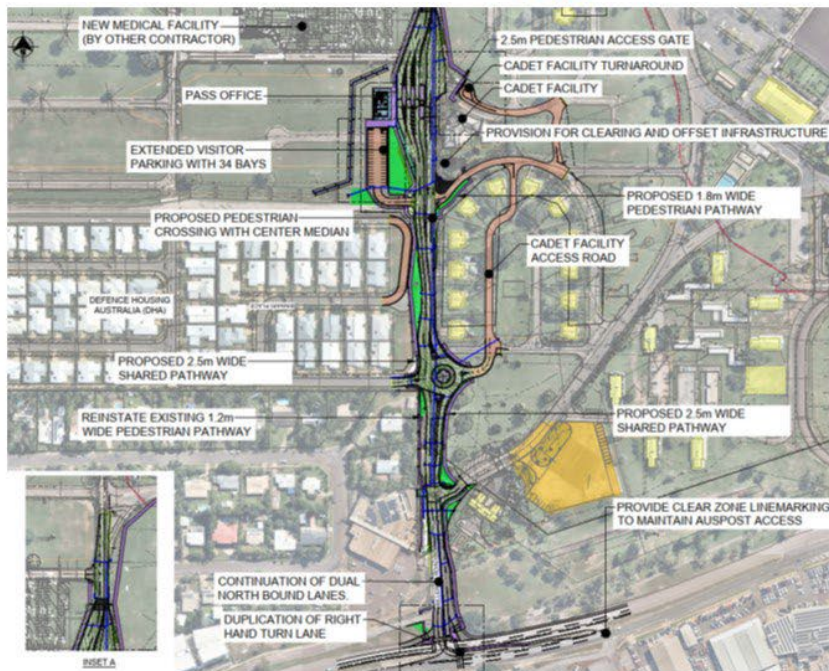


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Main Entrance Upgrade



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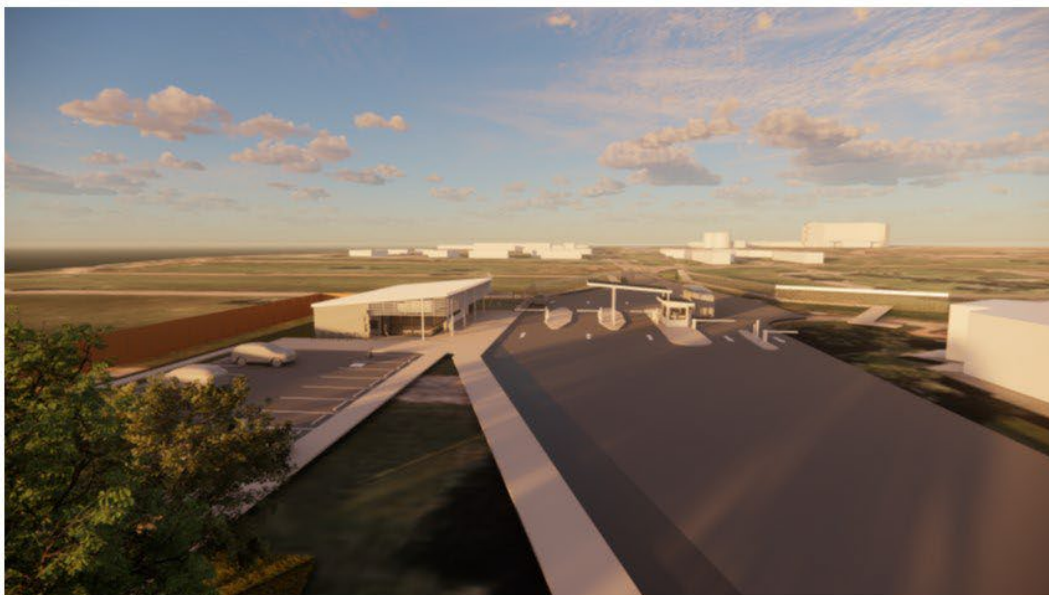


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Main Entrance Upgrade



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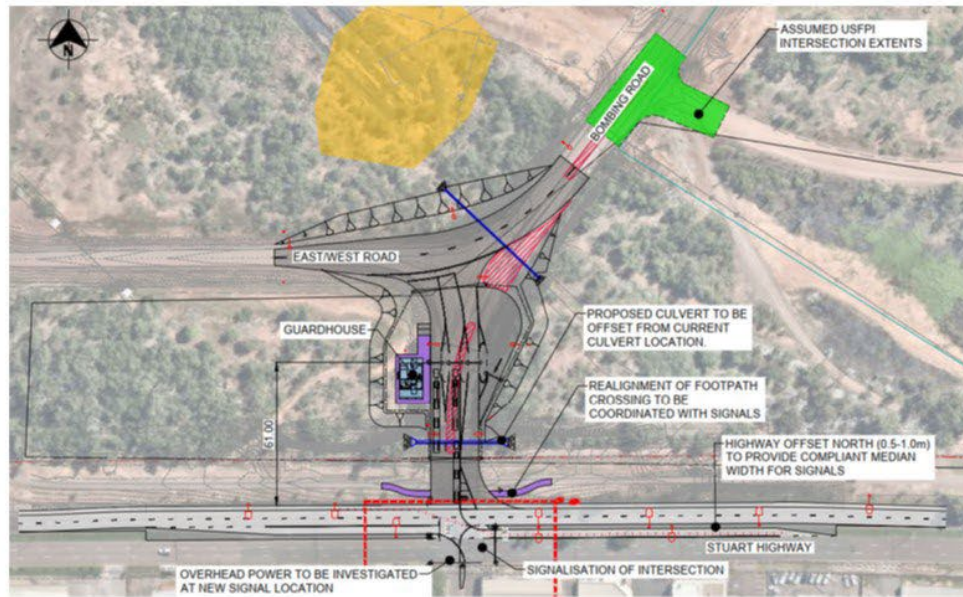


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Heavy Vehicle Entrance Upgrade



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Heavy Vehicle Entrance Upgrade



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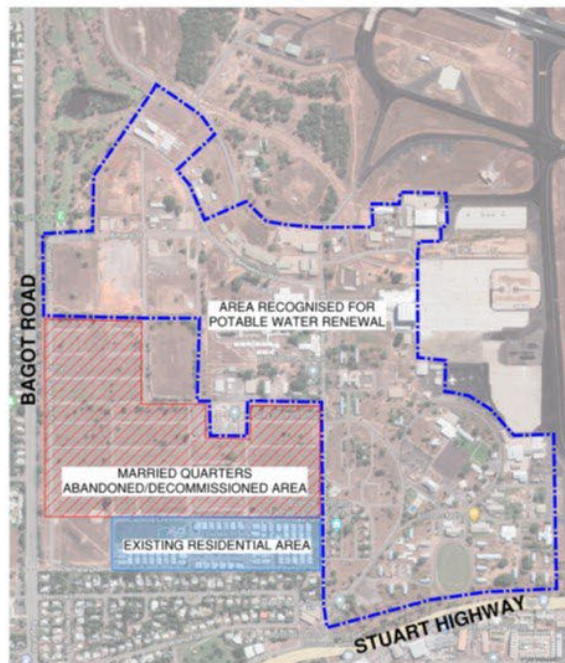
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Potable Water Network Upgrade



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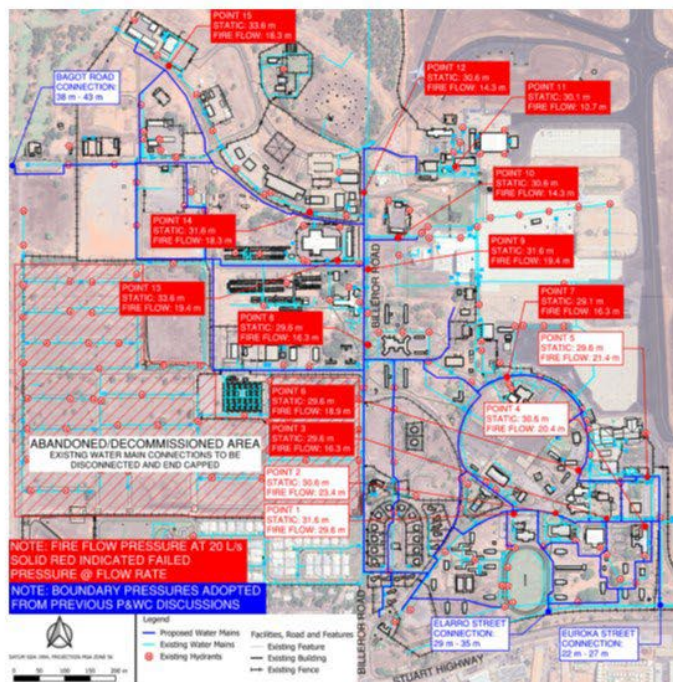


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Potable Water Network Upgrade



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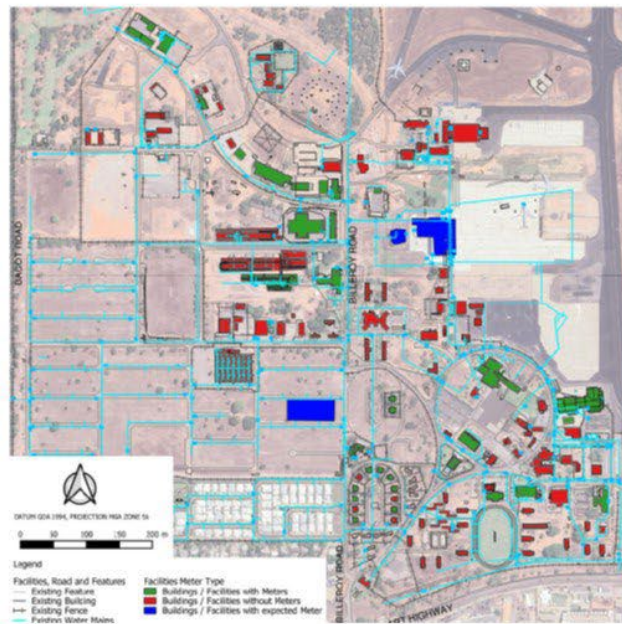


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Potable Water Network Upgrade



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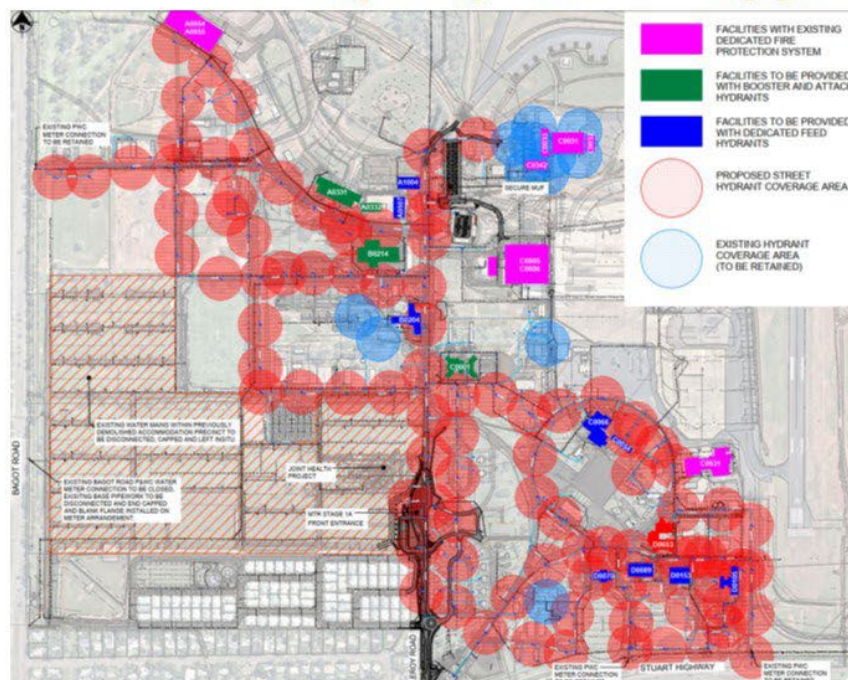
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Firefighting Network Upgrade



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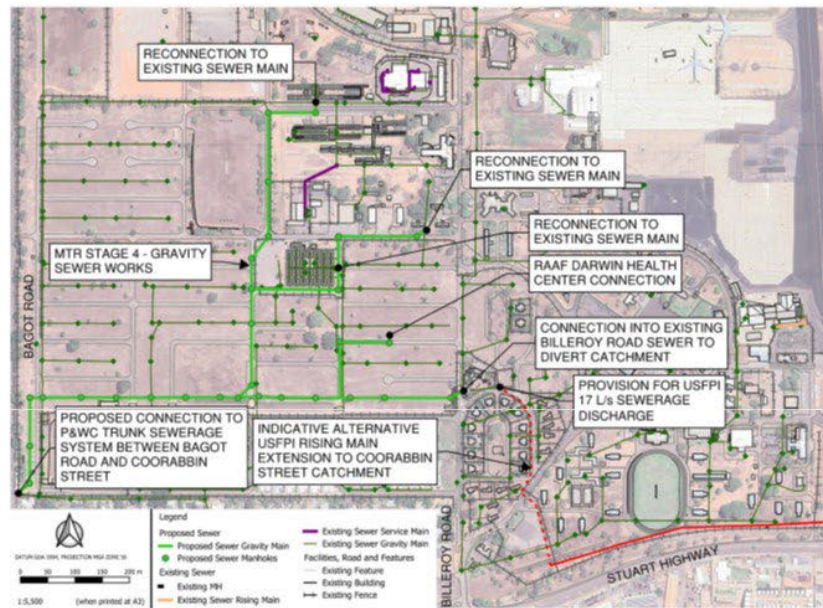
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Sewer Network Upgrade

RAAF DARWIN MID TERM REFRESH PROJECT

I would like to inform you of works proposed by the Department of Defence under the RAAF Darwin Mid Term Refresh Project ("the project"). The Project proposes to deliver facilities and infrastructure within the RAAF Base, including substantial upgrade of two existing base entrances along the Stuart Highway.

This work will deliver enhanced resilience and redundancy to the Base, which supports Defence's strategic objectives.

The works include:

- A replacement high-capacity main entrance for the Base,
- An upgraded entrance for heavy vehicle access to the Base for explosive ordnance and fuel deliveries,
- Capacity, condition and compliance upgrades to the potable water network,
- Capacity, condition and compliance upgrades to the firefighting water network; and
- Capacity, condition and compliance upgrades to the sewer network.

Most construction works will be conducted within the Base, while the enhancement of the two entrances will improve trafficability along the Stuart Highway through additional queuing capacity to the existing main entry and a new signalised intersection at Bombing Road. The designs of each of these entrances have been closely coordinated with the Department of Infrastructure, Planning and Logistics.

Mr Gosling was advised that the project was targeting 90% of trade spend in the immediate Darwin area with an additional 5% in the Northern Territory. Monitoring of the contractor local industry plan was central to the delivery of the project. Further, recent subcontractor briefings had garnered significant interest with more than 240 attendees at an early October 2023 briefing on forthcoming tendering opportunities.
Community Engagement Level of community engagement during the design process.		Mr Gosling was advised that there was an extensive level of community consultation throughout the entire design phase of the project, notably with the NT Government's Department of Infrastructure, Planning and Logistics and Power & Water Corporation. The project has obtained the requisite authority approvals from each of these agencies, while further design and stakeholder coordination was also necessary with Australia Post, the local Winnellie shops and nearby Defence Housing community.
