## Submission to the Inquiry into the Fair Work Amendment (Small Business-Penalty Rates Exemption) Bill 2012

I am a permanent employee, working as a Sales assistant, currently earning around 18 per hour.

I just finished studying, and I am about to get married. We have a mortgage.

If penalty rates were abolished... I would not work weekends. The only thing that attracts people is the pay incentive. I would pick my personal happiness over my work and working in retail there is little incentive to work a weekend unless there is a pay incentive.

I feel we as a society could never go back to a simpler time and healthier perspective if we remove the concept of the weekend. The only people that are being hurt are people who work in retail and hospitality. In higher income jobs the weekly income more than
