On 9 March 2021 the National Disability Insurance Agency (NDIA) and Department of Social Services made a submission to the inquiry into: *Independent assessments under the NDIS*. The NDIA seeks to make a supplementary submission to the inquiry.

On page 9 of the submission, under the 'Independent Assessment Framework and Tools section', the submission states:

The approach and the tools to be used have also been endorsed by leading Australian academics:
