Air

The number of drug detections has also increased by nearly 69% for the period 2008-09 to 2009-10 (see table below). The fall in total detections between years has largely come from fewer detections of quarantine referrals, intellectual property and minor prohibited items (i.e. fraudulent credit cards and objectionable DVDs) at express carrier premises. The fall in minor prohibited items and rise in drug detections is also partially attributed to a reporting change in recording of ‘medicaments’ – since 1 July 2009 these are now recorded as ‘drugs’ rather than ‘prohibited items’.

ATTACHMENT B - Definitions of a Major Find

Major Find – Air Cargo:

- All drug or precursor detections, including all detections suspected of being Performance or Image Enhancing Drugs (PIEDS), or specified non-narcotic drugs that are of a critical Tier 1 quantity (e.g. 20gms steroids, 25gms ephedrine BUT any amount of EPO or human growth hormone). Does not include prescription medications for personal use.
- All undeclared currency detections in excess of \$AUD10,000 or other currency equivalent.
- All fauna detections
- Anything which may be the subject of a media release or media interview – terrorism, quarantine, weapons, wildlife, drugs, health, illegal immigrants, family court matters etc
- Any Tier 2 items as specified in Schedule 1AA of the Customs regulations e.g. firearms and other weapons, reg 4a material, counterfeit credit and charge cards, undeclared radioactive materials, embryos and other similar viable material.
- Any seizures of undeclared merchantable consignments of cigarette or tobacco products – in the air cargo environment 10,000 sticks or greater, or, 8 kilos or greater.
- Anything with a suspected terrorism significance
- Any noteworthy commercial amount of intellectual property, copyright and country of origin infringements.
- Any breach meeting the following Infringement Notice Scheme Penalty Report criteria: - In the context of section 243T, the amount of revenue loss resulting from the false or misleading statement is more than \$1250.
- In the context of section 243U, there are 5 or more false or misleading particulars or omissions in the relevant statement.
- In the context of section 243V, there are 3 or more false or misleading particulars or omissions in the relevant cargo or outturn report.
- Any section 33 breaches.

Major Find – Sea Cargo:

- Any amount of drugs (including PIEDs) >1kg
- Any amount of cash > AUD \$50 000
- All fauna detections
- Any amount of precursor chemicals >1 kg
- An amount of loose tobacco/cigars > 100kg
- Any amount of cigarettes > 500 000 sticks
- Any commercial quantity of prohibited imports
- Any fake credit cards that may be the subject of a media release
- Any commercial quantity of undeclared firearms
- Anything with an unusual concealment method
- Anything which may be subject to a media release
- Anything with a suspected terrorism significance that may be the subject of a media release
- Any activity which would result, if undetected, in the irregular importation of goods valued at over AUD \$250 000 and/or loss of revenue exceeding AUD \$100 000
- Any noteworthy commercial amount of intellectual property, copyright and country of origin infringements
