- 5. Were any non-financial commitments made by the Commonwealth as a part of the vaccine purchase?
- 6. Has the Department facilitated negotiations with any other countries to purchase COVID-19 vaccine? If so -
- a. Which countries has the Department facilitated negotiations with?
- 7. What was the Department's involvement, if any, in accessing 500,000 COVAX facility doses of the Pfizer vaccine?

Answer

- 1. The Department worked closely with the Department of Health to negotiate the purchase and delivery of the vaccines. The Department of Health is the purchasing authority.
