Many families need to support their own rehab via their own means (which luckily i am currently able to do). I fear that there are many families with less fortunate circumstances who would only be able to offer government funded services (which as I say, are by my reckoning insufficient and prescriptive).

The main features of the NDIS that will make a difference to the community are:

The ability to receive services when needed and in the way that suits the person, Increased ability to coordinate services to suit the "whole" person/family, Access to reliable information about support options

The most important services for the NDIS to provide are:

Therapy and allied health services, Support for families and carers, Case management, planning and coordination

I support the introduction of the NDIS.

I support the NDIS as I feel as a community we will benefit from offering better options for those with disability (particularly around health services and rehab).

I have personally experienced the pain and frustration of dealing with therapy provider and multiple organisations around my own son's rehabilitation.
