Inquiry into the Commonwealth's treaty-making process

The only submission I wish to make is to draw attention to the dissenting view I expressed as a member of the Advisory Committee to the Constitutional Commission on the Distribution of Powers when I recommended the adoption on a trial statutory basis a proposal to require parliamentary approval for Australia's entry into international treaties: Report (1987) published as Appendix J at pp 233 – 236. It was shared by a member of the Constitutional Commission, the late Professor Leslie Zines, even though he too was in dissent on the issue: Constitutional Commission Final Report (1988) vol 2 at pp 745 – 6 paras 10,525.

The view we adopted relates to paras (a) and (b) of the Terms of References for the above Inquiry.

I still adhere to that view and am not aware of any developments that would lead me to change my mind on the issue.
