It is only the penalty rates received that in some way compensate us for working on weekdends and working while their are family functions on, birthdays etc.

I urge the committee to keep penalty rates. We who are wanting these penalty rates kept are already amongst the lowest paid workers out there. That is why we have to do the horrible shift hours/weekends to get penalty rates to bring our miserable pay rates up a bit. We dont have the luxury of huge salaries, huge super schemes and a huge, AMWE-indexed super pension scheme like you all do. We need penalty rates, so let us keep them.
