The remaining documents, 26 February to 31 March 2020 are unable to be released as they are considered to be Cabinet in Confidence.

#### By way of background:

- Prior to the COVID-19 outbreak, the AHPPC was a pre-existing body under the Council of Australian Government. When the National Cabinet for Australia's Coronavirus Response (National Cabinet) was established, documents prepared by AHPPC, including meeting minutes, were thereafter treated as Cabinet-in-Confidence.
- 'Cabinet documents' include material that has been 'created for the purpose of
  informing a proposal to be considered by the Cabinet' (Cabinet Handbook). Material
  prepared for and considered by the AHPPC including minutes, which is in turn
  provided to the National Cabinet, or which are reflected in submissions AHPPC made
  to the National Cabinet, or in the deliberations or decision of National Cabinet, are
  treated as Cabinet-in-Confidence.
- The documents requested relate to information and matters communicated in confidence between the State Governments and the Commonwealth Government. To ensure the continued effective consultation process undertaken by the AHPPC, it is necessary that the documents remain confidential and are not disclosed.
