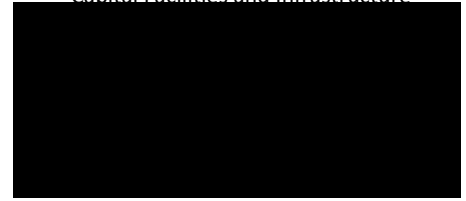

COMMUNITY CONSULTATION REPORT
ARMOURED FIGHTING VEHICLES FACILITIES PROGRAM – STAGE 2

1. The Armoured Fighting Vehicles Facilities Program – Stage 2 (the Project) was referred to the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works on 3 August 2023, The Project proposes to deliver facilities and infrastructure at:

- a. Gallipoli Barracks located in the Enoggera region, Queensland;
- b. Gaza Ridge Barracks located in the Bandiana region, Victoria; and
- c. Edinburgh Defence Precinct located in the Elizabeth region, South Australia.

2. This letter is to inform the Committee of the nature and extent of community consultation that has been undertaken by the Department of Defence for these proposed works. The aim of the consultation is to ensure local communities and other stakeholders are:

- a. well informed about project details through effective and proven communication channels.
- b. provided the opportunity to raise any concerns or issues, or to seek further information so that, wherever feasible, Defence could address these in its proposed works.

3. the following stakeholder and community consultation activities were delivered in accordance with the Project's comprehensive community engagement strategy:

- a. Advertising community information sessions in relevant local newspapers in Brisbane, Adelaide, and the Albury-Wodonga region, and establishing a project email address to receive submissions and questions about the Project. These details are included in the example advertisement shown at **Annex A**.

- b. Conducting three community information sessions, one each in:
 - a. Enoggera, Queensland on 30 August 2023,
 - b. Wodonga, Victoria on 28 August 2023, and
 - c. Salisbury, South Australia on 29 August 2023.

The type of information Defence presented to the public is shown at **Annex B**, and the level of attendance is provided at **Annex C**.

- c. Advertising community information sessions through a letterbox drop to 14,251 households in the surrounding suburbs of Gallipoli Barracks, Queensland. The details are included in the example advertisement shown at **Annex A**
 - d. Inviting key stakeholders, including Federal, State and Local Members of Government, and local community and business groups to receive a personal briefing about the Project. An example of the invitation that was sent out is at **Annex D**, and a list of all stakeholders engaged by the Project, including the status of each engagement, is provided at **Annex E**.
 - e. An interview was conducted on ABC Radio Brisbane with COL Antony Rogers, Director National, Capital Facilities and Infrastructure Branch, on 25 August 2023. This interview discussed the proposed AVSS Simulation Centre and potential impacts to the surrounding residential community, and the upcoming Community Consultation session for the proposed Gallipoli Barracks Works.
4. A summary of topics and key issues raised during community information sessions is provided at **Annex F**.
5. Information about the proposed works was generally well received at the Community Information Sessions and feedback to date has been supportive. Defence has not been made aware of any objections to the proposed works.
6. Comments raised by members of the community focused on:
- a. The type of works being proposed at Gaza Ridge Barracks and Edinburgh Defence Precinct, the timing of the tender/construction periods and trade cost for these work packages.
 - b. The location and types of facilities being delivered at Edinburgh Defence Precinct and Gallipoli Barracks, and if there would be an increase in traffic as a result of the Project.
7. Consultation activities are continuing, with potential for Defence to provide further briefings to Federal, State and Local Members of Government. These ongoing activities can be further advised at the upcoming Hearing.

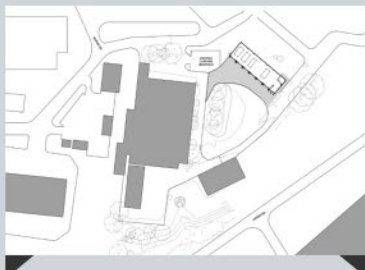

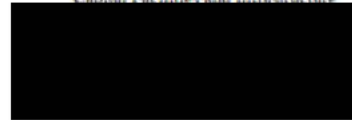
