#### Re: National Health Amendment (Parliament Benefits Scheme) Bill 2010 Submission

Thank you for inviting NPS to comment on the Community Affairs inquiry into the National Health Amendment (PBS) Bill.

NPS supports this Bill with the view that it will allow the sector to further concentrate on the quality and safety of prescribing.

Essentially we consider that the provisions for collection of under-co-payment data will provide a more complete picture of PBS medicine prescribing, dispensing and usage. This information will allow the sector to focus on the quality and safety of all medicine usage during every stage of the medication process.
