Thank you for the invitation to provide a submission to the Parliamentary Joint Committee on Law Enforcement's Inquiry into vaccine-related fraud and security risks. ACLEI has not been made aware of any allegations of corruption issues (within the scope of the *Law Enforcement Integrity Commissioner Act 2006*) relating to vaccine fraud. As such, ACLEI will not make a formal submission on this occasion. However, we offer some observations that may assist the Secretariat's work in support of the inquiry.

State and Territory health and integrity agencies are well placed to provide information on actual and potential vaccine-related fraud and security risks given their specific role in the vaccine rollout in Australia.

Some common corruption vulnerabilities that come to ACLEI's attention include unauthorised access and modification of information. These are relevant considerations in the context of ongoing discussions of vaccine passports and accompanying requirements to record and register vaccination status. Law enforcement officials may also be exposed to heightened corruption risk in a future context where they have to enforce vaccine passports as part of their border control functions.
