Dear Dr Southcott

On 22 September 2014, the Joint Committee of Public Accounts and Audit (JCPAA) released Report No. 445: Regional Cities Program, KPIs and Medicare.

On 19 March 2015, the former Minister for Social Services, the Hon Scott Morrison MP, provided the Government's response to recommendation three and provided the first status update of houses built with the assistance of the Building Better Regional Cities (BBRC) programme.

This letter attaches the second six-monthly report on the status of houses built with the assistance of the BBRC programme for tabling with the JCPAA.

The latest six-monthly report shows that nine of the total 15 projects in the BBRC Program are continuing to make progress in delivering affordable housing. It also shows that six projects have not yet delivered any affordable housing. This is primarily due to the impact of previous delays with infrastructure or changes in market demand for housing. The Department is working with local councils to put in place steps to effectively manage projects to conclusion.
