CHAIR: ... Could I ask you, just for educating the committee, what is Coleambally Irrigation's licence? How much water?

Mr Culleton: At privatisation we started with 621,516 megalitres. Since then we have had 84,639 megalitres leave our licence, of which 37,621 went via buyback.

CHAIR: And the others were traded to other entities?
Mr Culleton: No. Some of the others went in smart government purchases. So, when I say 'buyback', I am being blunt. Some of them have gone to Water Smart Australia projects, PIIOP projects and on-farm efficiency. I could give you a complete breakdown of that.
