I am a permanent employee, working as a nurse, currently earning around \$ 26 per hour.

I work as a nursing assistant full-time at a rehab hospital. I am also studying full-time at uni to become a Registered Nurse. I am also looking after my wife who lost her job during the Global Financial Crisis and our two-year-old son.

If weekend penalty rates were abolished, I would not earn enough to pay my bills, my rent, my electricity and petrol.

My weekends are important to me because I need the penalty rates to make ends meet. I need to work full-time just to be able to stay ahead of my bills. If I were to lose my weekend rates, I'd be forced to ask money from the government to cover all my

costs.

I urge the committee to keep penalty rates. I'm barely earning enough money as a nurse to keep up with all my increasing expenses. My meagre earnings as a nurse will go down even more if I lost my weekend penalty rates. I'd be forced to quit my profession and working in the NSW healthcare system if weekend penalty rates were abolished. I imagine all of my coleauges would do the same.
