- It is very complex and will bring much frustration/misunderstanding to families and services.
- The activity test will adversely affect families who do not work and, those whose work/study hours are less than the prescribed number for eligibility namely, vulnerable children at risk and/or from disadvantaged backgrounds who benefit most from participating in quality early childhood education and care. Their parents would not be able to afford sending their children to quality ecce programs without the subsidy/support!
- It will have a negative impact on Aboriginal Budget Based services funding shortfalls make it very difficult to run essential programs.
- A detrimental effect on the quality of the early childhood education and care workforce with the removal of funded professional development.
