- a. The number of businesses currently receiving JobKeeper. Please breakdown by state and territory.**

The number of organisations which have had at least one application processed for the JobKeeper Payment extension in October and/or November as at midnight Tuesday, 1 December was 505,811. Note that applications for the November JobKeeper fortnights opened on 1 December. A breakdown by State and Territory is given below.

The State and Territory break down is based on the registered business address of the organisation as notified by the employer to the Australian Taxation Office, it is not necessarily where employees reside.
