Senator Keneally asked:

- 1. When did the Department first make contact with the Ruby Princess during its voyage that terminated at Circular Quay on 19 March 2020?
- 2. When did the Department first receive a Human Health Report from the Ruby Princess? Please be prepared to table these reports on 5 May, and please circulate electronic copies of the reports via the Committee Secretariat in advance of the hearing (at least 30 mins prior) to assist Senators who are participating in the hearing remotely.
- 3. Please provide a list of federal agencies that have access to the Maritime Arrivals Reporting System.
- 4. According to a COVID-19 fact sheet entitled 'Information for the cruise industry' released by the Australian government on 6 March, if an ill traveller is reported 'a biosecurity officer will liaise with the vessel to screen for COVID-19'. The Ruby Princess reported 158 ill passengers, including 17 with high fevers. How many federal biosecurity officers met the Ruby Princess's 2,700 passengers when it docked in Sydney on 17 March?
 - a. What actions did these officers take to screen for COVID-19?
- 5. The same COVID-19 fact sheet states that disembarking cruise ship passengers with no signs or symptoms of COVID-19 'must wear a surgical mask' when travelling domestically or on public transport or in taxis in Australia to reach their home. Did federal biosecurity officers direct the 2,700 disembarking passengers from the Ruby Princess to wear a surgical mask to travel home?

Answer:

1. The Department of Agriculture, Water and the Environment's first contact with the Ruby Princess prior to its docking on 19 March 2020 was at 14:09 on 16 March 2020, via the Maritime Arrivals Reporting System (MARS). This contact was in response to the Ruby Princess completing its initial pre-arrival reporting at 13:46 on 16 March 2020 which indicated people on board had symptoms that may be consistent with a listed human disease.

MARS issued the Ruby Princess with a document outlining berthing arrangements for its arrival in Sydney which stated that human health issues notified by the vessel would be assessed and the vessel must display the quarantine signal. The vessel was also required to update the Department of any changes.

- 2. The Ruby Princess submitted its initial pre-arrival report, including human health reporting on 16 March 2020 at 13:46 (Attachment A) to the Department in MARS. Three additional human health updates were provided to the Department on:
 - a. 16 March 2020 at 15:01 (Attachment B)
 - b. 18 March 2020 at 08:54 (Attachment C)
 - c. 18 March 2020 at 19:21 (Attachment D)

Ruby Princess docked in Sydney at 02:29 on 19 March 2020.

3. The Maritime Arrivals Reporting System is a platform for commercial vessels to report information relevant to assessing biosecurity risk.

The Department of Agriculture, Water and the Environment administers MARS and is the only federal agency which accesses it on a routine basis for the purpose of assessing biosecurity risk.

Relevant information is provided to state health agencies for the purpose of assessing human biosecurity risk. Processes exist specific to each jurisdiction to facilitate this.

• In the case of NSW, relevant health officials have direct access to information contained in MARS, including vessel pre-arrival and human health reports.

The Department of Defence has access to MARS in order to complete pre-arrival reporting for defence vessels.

- 4. The last human health update from the Ruby Princess provided to the Department in MARS for the voyage arriving on 19 March reported (Attachment D):
 - a. 128 passengers ill
 - b. 24 with temperatures over 38 degrees

The voyage prior, arriving 8 March 2020, reported 158 passengers ill and 13 with a fever.

Four biosecurity officers attended the Ruby Princess on 19 March 2020.

Prior to biosecurity officers boarding the vessel, NSW Health had undertaken an assessment of the information provided by the Ruby Princess, informed by direct communication with the vessel. NSW Health advised there were no issues preventing disembarkation.

On the morning of 19 March 2020, biosecurity officers reconfirmed with NSW Health the approach to managing passengers and the advice remained there were no concerns relating to passengers leaving the vessel. Biosecurity officers disembarked passengers, consistent with this advice.

Officers completed required vessel inspections and passenger baggage clearances. Officers also provided the relevant Department of Health COVID-19 factsheet (Attachment E) to passengers, and advised them of their requirement to self-isolate for 14 days from arrival.

5. No.

The arrangements that applied to passengers on the Ruby Princess is set out in the attached fact sheet (Attachment E).

Consistent with the Commonwealth Health fact sheet, there was no requirement for passengers disembarking the Ruby Princess to wear masks.

This is because the vessel did not report travellers who had been in or transited through a high-risk country, nor had there been alternate health advice that passengers should wear masks. Consistent with NSW Health advice, ill passengers were wearing masks when they disembarked.

Novel coronavirus (COVID-19)

Information for international travellers

There is currently a global outbreak of novel coronavirus (COVID-19).

Symptoms of COVID-19 are similar to other respiratory illnesses and can include fever, sore throat, cough, tiredness and shortness of breath. This information sheet should be read in conjunction with the 'What you need to know' and 'Isolation guidance' information sheets. Go to www.health.gov.au/covid19-travellers.

Who is required to stay at home?

All travellers must isolate for a period of 14 days after they have entered Australia. If you need to transit domestically, you may complete this transit and then begin your precautionary 14 day self-isolation period. If you have a layover, you must remain in the airport or self-isolate in your accommodation for the transit period. Refer to the 'Isolation guidance' information sheet for further information.

You may also be required to undergo enhanced health screening on arrival in Australia.

What do I do if I am sick right now?

If you are experiencing symptoms of COVID-19, let a member of the airline or ship crew know now. If you are in the airport or seaport contact a biosecurity officer now.

What do I do if I get sick while in Australia?

If you become unwell, you must:

- Stay in your home or hotel.
- Isolate yourself from others and use a separate bathroom if available.
- Put on a surgical mask if you are near other people. If you don't have one, cover your cough and sneeze.
- Wash your hands frequently with soap and water and use alcohol-based hand rub.
- Call a doctor and tell them your recent travel history.

If you have serious symptoms such as difficulty breathing, call 000, ask for an ambulance and notify the ambulance officers of your recent travel history.

How can I prevent the spread of coronavirus?

Practising good hand and sneeze/cough hygiene is the best defence against most viruses:

- Wash your hands frequently with soap and water, including before and after eating, and after going to the toilet.
- Cover your cough and sneeze, dispose of tissues, and wash your hands.
- If unwell, avoid contact with others (stay more than 1.5 metres from people).
