## **Senator Dodson and Senator Lines asked the following question:**

**Senator DODSON:** Mr Lewis, has the Attorney-General's Department been requested to provide advice on the government acquiring the Aboriginal flag?

**Senator LINES:** I'm simply asking if you've been asked, as the A-G's office, for that advice. It's a yes or no answer unless you think it goes to the issue of privileged advice, and you haven't claimed that.

## The response to the Senator Dodson and Senator Lines questions is as follows:

Legal advisers owe a duty to their clients not to disclose the existence or content of legal advice. That position is reflected in paragraph 4.8.1 of the *Government Guidelines for Official Witnesses before Parliamentary Committees and Related Matters*. The department therefore generally does not disclose whether it has provided legal advice.
