I'm currently a student at the ANU and have been working for the last two and a half years to put myself through it without CentreLink support. This is because

- A) I see the contempt my friends that do receive youth allowance have for those taxpayers in the workforce
- B) Through some weird glitch in the system, I'm not eligible for even the bare minimum I need to live
- C) I enjoy being independent

The government's proposal for compulsory student unionism will hurt those like me who do not support the activities of all the affiliated clubs on campus.

While I do not see the harm in allowing these clubs to exist, forcing all students to pay for them is clearly a conflict of interest, especially if these groups are engaging in activities others at the university may find offensive. VSU negates this by forcing a user pays system, thus removing all involvement except by those involved and also moves ownership of any problems that may arise from the backs of the universities.

Creating a politically connected group of students is a very dangerous activity. When my education is held to ransom until I pay fees to a union I never wanted to be a part of in the first place, I feel as if my natural right to NOT associate myself with such an organisation has been violated and left me without a voice, not to mention a lighter bank account which I struggle to keep in the black anyway.

Please consider these points very carefully when advising on this policy, there will be a lot of unhappy students in Australia if you bring back a mandatory regime.
